

ART, CONCENTRATION—INTERIOR DESIGN ACADEMIC MAP: DEGREE BS (120 CREDIT HOURS)

This degree map is a semester-by-semester sample course schedule for students majoring in Art with a concentration in Interior Design. The milestones listed to the right of each semester are designed to keep a student on track to graduate in four years. The schedule serves as a general guideline to help build a full schedule each semester. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progress to complete a major. When one or more milestones are missed, students should consult with an academic advisor to determine if another degree path would be more suitable.

The Art Department offers a major in Art leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science with concentrations in Studio Art and Art Education and Design. The Design concentration prepares students for careers in interior design and textile design. This is a creative, as well as a technical field, with tremendous opportunities for growth in all areas. A broad curriculum provides a foundation for students to gain insight into ho the principles and elements of design can be manipulated to create a function al and aesthetically pleasing interior space that will complement the client's best features. Students may focus on a particular area of design, with their coursework culminating in an internship in their chosen field. Interior design firms and manufactures have all selected graduates from our program. As a designer you may even be employed in a design division of a corporation or institution or open you own design studio.

For admission to the upper-division program of Art, students must complete all of the Art Core Requirements, completed the Sophomore Review and earned a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on college-level course work.

Tennessee State University recognizes that students have diverse learning, life, and professional experiences.
