

ENGLISH ACADEMIC MAP: DEGREE BA (120 CREDIT HOURS)

This degree map is a semester-by-semester sample course schedule for students majoring in **English**. The milestones listed to the right of each semester are designed to keep a student on track to graduate in four years. The schedule serves as a general guideline to help build a full schedule each semester. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progress to complete a major. When one or more milestones are missed, students should consult with an academic advisor to determine if another degree path would be more suitable.

As a student in the College of Liberal Arts, you are expected to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.00. English majors may not have any "D"s in any major field course. Students who incur a probationary status are to repeat failed courses, or courses in which "D"s were earned, during the semester immediately following that in which the grades were earned. The College has a special program to assist students who are on probation. Please contact the Academic Coordinator for details.

To enroll in upper-level (3000 and 4000 numbered courses) English classes, students must meet the following requirements: (a) Complete 60 credit hours of lower-division requirements; (b) Earn a "C" or better in both English 1010 and English 1020 and completed ENGL 2310 and ENGL 2320; (c) Have a 2.00 GPA or better in lower-division courses. The BA in English also requires that a student show proficiency in a foreign language at the intermediate level (this is equivalent to passing SPAN 2020 or FREN 2020).
