

HEALTH SCIENCES, CONCENTRATION-HEALTH SCIENCES GENERAL ACADEMIC MAP: DEGREE BS (120 CREDIT HOURS)

This degree map is a semester-by-semester course schedule for students majoring in Health Sciences, General Concentration. The milestones listed to the right of each semester are designed to keep a student on track to graduate in four years. The map serves as a general guideline to help build a full schedule each semester. The milestones include courses and the special requirements necessary for students to complete the requirements for the degree on a timely basis. When one or more milestones are missed, students should consult with an academic advisor to determine if another degree path would be more suitable.

Acceptance into Tennessee State University (TSU) does not guarantee acceptance into the Health Sciences (HLSC) program. To enroll in courses within the HLSC major (Health Care Administration and Health Sciences courses), students must be accepted into the program by submitting a *Public Health, Health Administration, an Health Sciences (PHHAHS) Department Application*. A minimum GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) is required to be considered for admission to the Bachelor of Science degree program in *Health Sciences, General Concentration*. Students may submit a Department Application during their first semester sophomore year. Applications are accepted and processed year-round for admission to the program. The application packet consists of: a department application; two letters of recommendation, a personal goals statement, and a recent transcript.

All HLSC students will be assigned to a faculty advisor in the department. Each semester before registering for classes, students should meet with the faculty advisor and not self-advise.

After acceptance into Health Sciences, General Concentration, the following retention polices apply:

- 1. Students must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (on a scale of 4.0).
- 2. Students must earn a "C" or better in all major courses and supporting courses in English, Mathematics, Health Sciences and Health Care Administration (HCAP), and other supporting courses. Failure to maintain a "C" in any of these courses will result in repeating the course the next semester the course is offered with the approval of the advisor.
- 3. Students who earn a grade less than a "C" in the same HCAP or HLSC courses for two semesters will be dismissed from the *Health Sciences* Program.

Students who have been dismissed from the HLSC program for poor academic performance must re-apply for readmission. Students who request readmission should present evidence to the HLSC Admissions Committee of the substantial change in circumstances warranting reconsideration, and explain the circumstances that led to poor performance as well as what was done to improve academically (i.e., tutoring, counseling to enhance study skills, time management skills, etc.).

Students who opt to major in the *Health Sciences, General Concentration,* should graduate with an overall GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) to be competitive when applying for graduate programs.

Tennessee State University recognizes that students have diverse learning, life, and professional experiences. The University provides opportunities for students to earn college credit toward the degree through a number of assessment options to evaluate their learning experiences. These paths are grouped under the category "Prior Learning Assessment" (PLA). There are various ways of earning PLA credit at TSU, they include the following: an Advanced Placement (AP) Program, the American Council of Education (ACE) Military Credit, the College Level Exam Program (CLEP), the DSST Credit by Examination Program (this includes the DANTES Examination), the Institutional Course Challenge Exams (Departmental Exams), International Baccalaureate Credit, other Military Service, and a Portfolio Assessment.
