

**HEALTH SCIENCES, CONCENTRATION—PUBLIC HEALTH ACADEMIC MAP:
DEGREE BS (120 CREDIT HOURS)**

This degree map is a semester-by-semester course schedule for students majoring in **Health Sciences (HS) with a concentration in Public Health**. The milestones listed to the right of each semester are designed to keep a student on track to graduate in four years. The map serves as a general guideline to help build a full schedule each semester. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progress to complete a major. When one or more milestones are missed, students should consult with an academic advisor to determine if another degree path would be more suitable.

Acceptance into Tennessee State University (TSU) does not guarantee acceptance into the Health Science program. To enroll in courses within the major (Health Care Administration and Health Sciences), students must be accepted into the program by submitting a *Public Health, Health Administration and Health Sciences (PHHAHS) Department Application*. There are no deadlines to apply for admission. Applications are accepted and processed year-round for admission to the program. Students may submit a Department Application during their first semester sophomore year. Students are expected to meet with a departmental faculty advisor each semester. The application packet consists of: a department application; two letters of recommendation, a personal goals statement, and a recent transcript. Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) to be considered for admission to the Bachelor degree program in Health Sciences (Public Health concentration).

After a student is accepted for admission to the Health Science (Public Health concentration) Program, they must adhere to the following retention policy to remain in the Health Science Program:

1. Students must maintain minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (on scale of 4.0).
2. Students must earn a “C” or better in all major courses and supporting courses in Science, English, and Mathematics. Failure to maintain a “C” in any of these courses will result in the student repeating the course the next semester the course is offered with the approval of the Advisor.
3. Students who earn grade less than “C” in the same HCAP or HLSC courses for two semesters will be dismissed from the Health Science Program.

Each student will be assigned to a Faculty Advisor in the Department. Students should not self-advise. Each semester, the student should schedule a meeting with the Advisor before registering for classes.

Students who have been dismissed from the HS Program may apply for readmission. To request readmission, the student should present evidence to the Department’s Admission Committee of substantial change in circumstances warranting reconsideration. If a student is dismissed from the program for poor academic performance, he/she must re-apply for readmission to the HS Program and explain the circumstances that led to their poor performance and provide a plan to improve their academic performance (i.e., seek tutoring).

Students who opt to major in Health Sciences (Public Health concentration) should graduate with an overall GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in order to be competitive when applying for graduate programs in Public Health.

Tennessee State University recognizes that students have diverse learning, life, and professional experiences. The University provides opportunities for students to earn college credit toward the degree through a number of assessment options to evaluate their learning experiences. These paths are grouped under the category “Prior Learning Assessment” (PLA). There are various ways of earning PLA credit at TSU, they include the following: an Advanced Placement (AP) Program, the American Council of Education (ACE) Military Credit, the College Level Exam Program (CLEP), the DSST Credit by Examination Program (this includes the DANTES Examination), the Institutional Course Challenge Exams (Departmental Exams), International Baccalaureate Credit, other Military Service, and a Portfolio Assessment.
