

NURSING RN TO BSN ACADEMIC MAP: AASN/ADN-BSN Degree Completion Program

This degree map is a semester-by-semester sample course schedule for students majoring in RN to BSN Degree Completer Program. Students can complete the program with a Full time, semesters option (Summer and Fall) or with a Part time, 3 semesters option (Summer, Fall and Spring) The milestones listed to the right of each semester are designed to keep a student o track to graduate in four years. The schedule serves as a general guideline to help build a full schedule each semester. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progress to complete a major. When one or more milestones are missed, students should consult with an academic advisor to determine if another degree path would be more suitable.

The RN-BSN Degree Completion Program requires 60 credit hours of general education/nursing prerequisite courses and 30 hours of core nursing courses. Students earn at least 3 credit for clinical courses taken in their AASN or ADN programs. Registered Nurses (RNs) can have two general education/nursing prerequisite courses remaining to complete at the time of starting the RN-BSN Program. All earned grades must be or higher. The application deadline for admission to the RN-BSN Degree Completion Program is March 1st of each year; the applicant must be admitted or readmitted to Tennessee State University (TSU) in order to be admitted to the RN-BSN program. Students admitted to the program begin classes during the first summer session following admission. No entrance examination is required. The minimum overall **GPA** requirement for admission to the program is **2.50**. RNs must hold current unencumbered RN licensure.

The courses for the RN-BSN Plan of study are administered o line. Students must complete 90 clinical hours in community health nursing with an approved preceptor. RNs can choose to take fewer courses per semester as long as NURS 3320 is completed in the first semester of the program. All earned grades must b C or higher.

Tennessee State University recognizes that students have diverse learning, life, and professional experiences. The University provides opportunities for students to earn college credit toward the degree through a number of assessment options that evaluate their learning experiences. These paths are grouped under the category "Prior Learning Assessment" (PLA). Various means of earning PLA credit at TSU are the following: Advanced Placement Program, American Council of Education (ACE) Military Credit, College Level Exam Program (CLEP), DSST Credit by Examination Program (includes DANTES Examination), Institutional Course Challenge Exams (Departmental Exams), International Baccalaureate Credit, Other Military Service, Portfolio Assessment.
