HIGHER EDUCATIO EMERGENCY RELIEF FUNDS Reporting: Quarter Ended June 30, 2021

Tennessee State University (TSU) acknowledges that it signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education the Certification and Agreement assuring the Department that it plans to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the HIGHER EDUCATION EMERGENCY RESPOBNSE FUNDS to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Tennessee State University's total allocation under Section 18004(a)(1) of the HEERF is \$43,849,878 of which \$18,942,550 will go towards Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. The emergency funds for students will be used for students' expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19. As of June 30, 2021, \$3,573,470.00 in blanket grants has been disbursed from HEERF II.

The total number of TSU students eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds for our second round of payments was 5,051. TSU maintains that all eligible students had unplanned expenses due to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19, with Pell grant eligible students having greater financial need. Thus, grants were provided to eligible students as outlined below:
