- 1. Importing event from card
 - 1.1. Launch iMovie from the Dock.
 - 1.2. In iMovie File>New Project set the Aspect Ratio: to Standard (4:3) and type a name for your project.



1.3. File>New Event and enter the name for the event. In the figure below, TPA clip was entered. This will give you an empty event window.



1.4. Insert card in SD card slot on right side of the iMac – small slot below the CD/DVD drive slot or on the left side of the MacBook Pro





1.5. In the Import Event window either Automatic to import all clips from card or Manual to select specific clips



- 1.6. Import All or Checked
- 1.7. Name the event the same as the project
- 1.8. Click Done when all clips have finished importing
- 1.9. Eject the SD card by dragging its icon on the Desktop to the Trash in the Dock. The icon changes from trash to Eject

- 2. Building your Project
 - 2.1. Click and drag the yellow border across the clip content you want in your project
 - 2.2. Drag the selection fro the Event tray to the Project tray
 - 2.3. Repeat if you are using 2 clips
- 3. Exporting your Project to mp4 movie
 - 3.1. Share>Export using Quick Time
 - 3.2. In the Save exported file as... window set Export: to Movie to MPEG-4



- 3.3. Be sure the destination is Desktop. Click the Save button and take a short break. Rendering 10 15 minutes to video will take a while
- 4. Verify your movie
 - 4.1. Minimize (the little yellow button in the top left of the iMovie window) iMovie so you can see the Desktop.
 - 4.2. Double click your name.mp4 file on the Desktop to play it using Quicktime. Use the slider to quickly scan through your movie to be sure you've captured everything you need.



- 4.3. If all is well go on to Step 5. If not, go back to iMovie and repeat from Step 2.
- 5. Saving your copy
 - 5.1. Insert CD or DVD
 - 5.2. When the disk mounts, OK Open in Finder
 - 5.3. Drag rendered movie (name.mp4) to the disk icon on the desktop
 - 5.4. Burn **3** the file to the CD/DVD
 - 5.5. When completed, open the CD/DVD and verify that your movie plays.
 - 5.6. Eject the CD/DVD by dragging the disk icon to the Trash in the Dock. The icon changes from trash to Eject
