# Volunteer State Community College and Tennessee State University Partnership

<u>Vol State</u> and <u>Tennessee State University</u> (TSU) have collaborated to provide Vol State Associate's Degree students the opportunity to complete the TSU Criminal Justice Bachelor's Degree directly from the Vol State campus in Gallatin, TN rather than on the TSU campus in Nashville, TN. Upon completion of the Associate of Science Degree with a Criminal Justice emphasis through Vol State, students "transfer" to TSU for completion of the B.S. Degree (see reverse side for program requirements).

By offering all courses through Vol State, students can maintain their local residences, continue to work, and avoid the anxiety and hassle of travel or relocation.
