

DENTAL HYGIENE ACADEMIC MAP: DEGREE AAS (79 CREDIT HOURS)

This degree map is a semester-by-semester course schedule for students majoring in **Dental Hygiene (DHYG)**. The Pre – Admission Milestones listed to the right of each semester are courses and special requirements necessary for admissions into the Dental Hygiene program. Any missing Pre – Admissions Milestones will delay a student's acceptance into the program. The other milestones listed to the right of each semester are designed to keep a student on track to graduate in two years from the time of entry into the program. The schedule serves as a general guideline to help build a full schedule each semester. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progress to complete a major. When one or more milestones are missed, students should consult with an academic advisor to determine if another degree path would be more suitable.

The Department of Dental Hygiene is committed to ensure an educational program of excellence for its students. Therefore, admission to the Dental Hygiene program is considered on a competitive basis. The committee is charged with the responsibility of reviewing the applicants and accepting those who possess the finest credentials based on the listed admission requirements mentioned below.

Admission into the dental hygiene program is **highly competitive**. The final application deadline is January 15th. The Department accepts a class for admission the fall semester of each year; therefore, interviews are conducted in the spring prior to enrollment for the fall semester. Any application received after January 15th will not be considered for first round admission. A second and third application deadline, March 15 and May 15 is available to applicants who are currently enrolled in a prerequisite course or who missed taking the ATDH examination. Meeting this March and May 15th deadline places the applicant on an Alternate list, along with those not accepted in the initial Jan 15th application review. Rest assured this does not decrease your chances of acceptance.

- Two degree programs are offered by the Department of Dental Hygiene: The Associate of Applied Science, which is the primary program and the Bachelor of Science/Degree Completion. The Bachelor of Science/Degree Completion may serve as a foundation for further study. **NOTE: Students applying for entry into the B.S. Degree Completion Program must have completed the AAS Degree program and have been issued a license to practice Dental Hygiene (This program will not be available until fall 2024).**
- Graduates of the Associates of Applied Science degree program in Dental Hygiene are eligible to test for the National Dental Hygiene Board Examination and Regional/State Board Examinations throughout the country.
- **A student must be accepted into the University before applying to the Dental Hygiene program. A formal admission into the Dental Hygiene program is required prior to enrolling in any Dental Hygiene (DHYG) courses.**
 - **NOTE: Acceptance into the University does not ensure acceptance into the Dental Hygiene program. Following notification of acceptance to the University by the Office of Admissions and Records, the prospective dental hygiene applicant's admission material will be evaluated by the Dental Hygiene Admissions Committee. Dental Hygiene applicants will be informed of their acceptance or rejection by the Departments Admissions Committee.**

THESE ITEMS MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO APPLICATION SUBMISSION

- All High School Prerequisite Courses passed with a "C" or better (Chemistry, Biology and Algebra). Minimum GPA 2.5
- All College Prerequisite Courses passed with "C" or better (Anatomy & Physiology I, II; Microbiology, English Composition I, General Chemistry I)
- Minimum College GPA 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- ACT Score – 19 or better / SAT (Equivalent score) – 980 or better
- TOEFL Exam, only if applicable
- Any required Immunizations should be up to date.
- (ATDH), Admissions Test Dental Hygiene scores range (200-500); Program Benchmark 300-350
- The application for the ATDH will appear on www.ada.org/atdh. The ATDH Candidate Guide has now been posted.
- The fee for the ATDH is \$140, paid at the time of application. The administration of the ATDH will begin on September 1. The first testing window will end on October 31. Results for all test-takers in the first testing window will be released by December 1.

Note: All required information should be included in the [Application Packet](#). The TSU Dental Hygiene Department will not request any information from the University. Incomplete applications will not be considered complete. All course work with the rubric DHYG are delivered in lock-step and can only be taken during the designated semester listing.
