Steps for Summer Aid Evaluation

- 1. Student registers for summer classes
- 2. Student completes the Summer Aid Evaluation Request Form and turns it in to the Office
- 3. The Financial Aid office evaluates eligibility for all types of aid
- 4. Financial aid award shows on the student's MYTSU account

Important Summer Aid Facts

- Student must maintain satisfactory academic progress (SAP) at the end of Spring 2016 term in
 order to actually receive the awards when it comes time to disburse the summer aid. If the
 student is not making satisfactory academic progress at the time of disbursement, the aid will be
 cancelled. The SAP policy can be reviewed on the website.
- Students must be admitted to a degree-seeking program.
- Generally students must be enrolled and attending 6 hours in order to be eligible for summer financial assistance. It is rare that a student would be eligible for assistance with less than six hours.
- Disbursement of funds is determined by how the student is registered for classes, for example: A
 student enrolled in 3 credit hours in session one and 3 credit hours in session two will have two
 disbursements with the refund on the second disbursement.
- If you drop a class or withdraw during the summer, your aid may be cancelled, and you may owe the university money. Please contact a financial aid administrator before dropping classes.
- Loans have yearly limits based on the student grade level. Once spring grades have been posted, you may be eligible for more loan funds.
