#### UNIVERSITY HONORS COLLEGE

In 1963, Dr. Walter S. Davis, who was the second President of Tennessee State University (TSU), appointed a committee that was charged with the responsibility of studying honors programs and determining the feasibility of establishing one at the University. After completing the investigation, the committee recommended that TSU keep pace with many other universities throughout the country. As a result, an Honors Program for freshman students was started in the fall semester of 1964. Sophomore through senior level course work was added annually throughout 1968, thus marking the year of the first student to graduate with "University Honors", a distinction that is reserved for students who have successfully completed the requirements of the University Honors College (UHC). In January, 2016, the Honors Program was approved by the Tennessee Board of Regents and the Tennessee Higher Education Committee to be elevated from an Honors Program to an Honors College. The Honors College currently consists of over 400 multidisciplinary students who maintain an overall GPA of 3.25 or above. Dr. Coreen Jackson is the current Dean of the Honors College.
