6.	Be subject to the laws of the host country and accept responsibility for inf himself/herself with respect to those laws;	forming

7.	Adhere to all standards of conduct as defined in the TSU Rules of Conduct contract and the student conduct, rules and regulations of TSU, and cooperate with all directives and precautions issued by the program administrator(s);
8.	Refrain from the misuse of alcohol and any use of controlled substances or drugs of any type;
9.	Disclose any current or past medical condition (failure to disclose may result in removal from the program);
10.	Agree to indemnify, hold harmless, release and discharge TSU, TSU administrators, faculty and staff from any and all claims and expenses, including attorney's fees, for any injury, loss, or damage in any way related to or arising from the program abroad, including those related to travel to and from the program site, even if such injury, loss or damage is due to the negligence, whether ordinary or gross, of TSU, its employees, agents;
11.	Agree that the released parties assume no responsibility for any liability, damage, or injury that may be caused by the student's negligence or willful acts committed prior to, during, or after participation in the program;
12.	Accept termination of participation in the program abroad should his/her conduct be determined to be detrimental (see student rules of conduct contract) to the best interest of the program or TSU and/or dangerous to self or others. Termination is a decision left to the sole discretion of the program director, with the concurrence of the Executive Vice President-Academic Affairs and TSU Student Affairs Vice President. The Student is expected to bear the expense of transportation to return to the United States, and will receive no refund of fees in the event of dismissal, nor will academic credit be granted. Student agrees that she/he must return to the United States immediately following dismissal from the program. Student shall not be permitted to remain in the host country or travel to any country other than the U.S
13.	Accept termination of the program operation should TSU deem it unsafe for students to remain in the host country due to political instability, potential or actual terrorist acts, war or any other circumstance. Termination of program operation is a decision left to the sole discretion of the program director and ODIA
14.	Affirmatively acknowledge that certain U.S. laws, including the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and U.S. Constitutional Rights do not apply in foreign countries.
15.	Inform himself/herself of the limitations of their private health insurance while travelling abroad and to further understand that the limited health insurance coverage required does not cover major long term health issues
