A Workforce Registry is Coming to Tennessee

The Tennessee Early Childhood Training Alliance (TECTA) statewide management office at Tennessee State University has served as a program focused on raising the quality of child care in the state by providing quality training and supporting attainment of professional certificates and degrees for almost 25 years. During that time, TECTA has maintained a database of have received participants who financial administrative support within each degree program and training initiative. The database serves as a significant repository of statistics and details regarding the professional development of the early childhood workforce within Tennessee who have received TECTA training, higher education, and/or completed training through the Tennessee Child Care Online Training System (TCCOTS).

Today, Tennessee State University has the opportunity to collaborate with the Tennessee Department of Human Services to unite data from existing records into a new system known as the Workforce Registry. The Workforce Registry project will produce an integrated

data set that will serve as a repository of current statewide trainings and trainer information that links with licensing information, improvement data, and meets Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) Program requirements.

Many states have already developed early childhood and afterschool workforce registries that promote and capture data regarding the professional development and career advancement of their early childhood workforce. Tennessee will be joining these other states in this work to recognize and honor the professional achievements of the early childhood and afterschool workforce. It is our hope that the information gained from the registry will support not only those working in the field, but serve to inform policy makers and partners of continuing efforts to improve the quality of care for young children and families in the state.

This program year began with the launch of a new Shaken Baby Syndrome/Abusive Head Trauma online training and renewal of the training topics within the Before You Begin modules. Both of these training modules provide extensive health and safety training on topics required by the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) Program regulations.

The reauthorization of the Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) administered by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services also resulted in the addition of training requirements for child care providers. As a result, TCCOTS has included additional topics in the Before You Begin for Child Care Providers and Before You Begin for School Age training modules. These modules now include all the required material, with the exception of Child First Aid and CPR. The inclusion of the additional topics has provides the hours of credit required through training.

TCCOTS Updates: New Before You Begin Module

TECTA was contracted to modify the Before You Begin training module based on Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) recommended training topics for the TCCOTS training system. While the content already explored major CCDBG topics, the updating provided an opportunity to verify that the training was current and informed the public and child care providers on relevant child care topics. Before You Begin: New Caregiver and School-Age content was updated in the "Health and Safety" sections to include information on:

• The prevention and control of infectious diseases (including immunization) and the establishment of a grace period that allows homeless children and children in foster care to receive services while their families (including foster families) are taking any necessary action to comply with immunization and other health and safety requirements

- Prevention of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and use of safe sleeping practices information with clarifications based on information shared by DHS to providers
- The administration of medications, consistent with parental consent
- Emergency preparedness and response planning for emergencies
- Injuries and the handling and storage of hazardous waste information

New content was added relating to the prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions. Once the module was updated and the new content introduced, a time analysis indicated that an increase in training time was necessary to reflect the additional time required to complete the module. Once successfully completed, *Before You Begin: New Caregivers* and *Before You Begin: New School Age Caregivers* modules offer 4.5 hours and 4.0 hours of training respectively.

Dyersburg State Community College (DSCC) hosted a reception to celebrate the 25thanniversary of its DSCC Gibson County Center and the Tennessee Early Childhood Training Alliance (TECTA) program Friday, November 4, 2016. The DSCC Gibson County Center is located in Trenton, Tennessee and has been a home to the DSCC TECTA site since 1994.

At one time, the average age of all the students was 30 years old. This focus on educating adults was best exemplified by Cleo Williams-Turners, a TECTA-supported student majoring in Early Childhood. Ms. Williams-Turner regaled the group with highlights from her personal experience of returning to college after the age of 60. She was appreciative of the TECTA scholarship that allowed her to take a smaller course load over a longer period of time.

Valerie Williams, the Director of the Center of Excellence for Learning Sciences, spoke on behalf of Tennessee State University and the statewide TECTA management office. DSCC has been a partner and delivering approximately \$6.5 million in workforce development funding through the TECTA program. The Center has worked since 1995 to manage six Early Head Start programs in the region, with two located in Gibson County, with educational support from DSCC.





Don't let the online training frustrate you. Here are some easy tips to make the process easier and user friendly:

- Make sure you have Mozilla Firefox and Adobe Flash Player downloaded on your computer before you start the training. This is the recommend browser for the online training.
- When downloading Mozilla Firefox browser, make sure you select the option "Do not import anything" after the download has finished.
- Do not use tablets or mobile phones to complete the training because they do not support certain features of the online training (i.e. Adobe Flash Player).
- Make sure you check your profile to see if your workplace is listed before you start the training.
 If not, go to 'Profile' and click on the 'Employment' tab to add your workplace.
- Please read the employment message on 'Start Training.'
- When retrieving and printing your certificates, please use a Windows computer or laptop.
