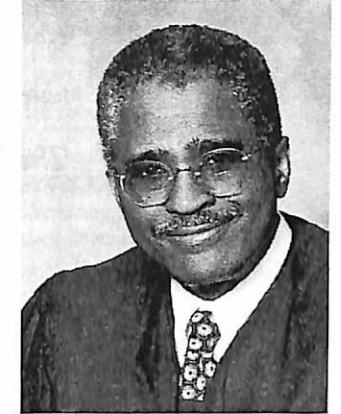

Facts About *Tennessee State University*

- Tennessee State University offers 43 bachelor's degrees and 26 master's degrees, and awards doctoral degrees in five areas: biological sciences, psychology, public administration, curriculum and instruction, and administration and supervision.
- Tennessee State University's enrollment has climbed consistently in recent years, reaching more than 8,700 in 1998.
- Tennessee State University's College of Business holds accreditation from the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). TSU is the only institution in Nashville to hold AACSB accreditation at both the undergraduate and graduate levels and is one of fewer than 24 percent of colleges nationwide to have earned the accreditation. In January 1998, Dr. Ruthie Reynolds became the first holder of the Frist Chair of Excellence in the College of Business. Funds have been secured for a Chair of Excellence in Banking and Finance.
- Tennessee State University boasts an eminently qualified faculty, nearly 75 percent of whom hold the doctorate or terminal degree in their field.
- Tennessee State University is home to two centers of excellence: the Center of Excellence for Research and Policy on Basic Skills and the Center of Excellence for Information Systems Engineering and Management.
- Tennessee State University is a major producer of African-American engineers. In the past 12 years, eight TSU engineering graduates have earned awards in various categories through the Black Engineer of the Year program, sponsored by *U.S. Black Engineer* magazine.
- Tennessee State University is one of a select number of universities nationwide to grant a bachelor's degree in Africana Studies. The program was launched in 1994.
- Tennessee State University is the only higher education institution in Nashville to have a chapter of Phi Kappa Phi, the most prestigious honor society encompassing scholars from all disciplines.
- Tennessee State University carries out nearly 100 public service projects each year, ranging from programs to help welfare recipients become self-sufficient to teaching area school children how to monitor the activity of stars through computers.
- For the past five years, Tennessee State University has been listed among the best national universities in *U. S. News & World Reports* annual "Guide to America's Colleges and Universities."

Ralph D. Cook



Ralph D. Cook was appointed Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Alabama by the Honorable Jim Folsom, Jr., Governor of the State of Alabama on November 1, 1993 and elected to this position November 8, 1994. In 1981, he was appointed circuit judge in the Bessemer Division of the Tenth Judicial Circuit by Governor Fob James and was twice elected. Justice Cook served in the domestic relations division of the court until 1984 and served in the civil division of the court until November 1, 1993. Prior to his appointment to the circuit court, he was elected district court judge and served for four and one-half years in the Family Court of Jefferson County, Bessemer Division.

In August 1976, Justice Cook was appointed dean of Miles Law School, Birmingham, Alabama and remained in that position until May 1990. He continues to serve as a law professor in the law school. He has also taught at San Jose State University and Cabrillo College in California and Miles College in Birmingham. Justice Cook served as an assistant district attorney in Bessemer and was engaged in the private practice of law.

Educated in the public schools of Jefferson County, Alabama, he earned a bachelor of science degree at Tennessee State University, Nashville, Tennessee and a juris doctor degree from Howard University School of Law, Washington, D.C.

Justice Cook has been recognized for his work and received awards from community organizations, colleges and churches throughout the State of Alabama. He is a member of the Alabama State Bar Association, California State Bar, National Bar Association, Birmingham Bar Association and Bessemer Bar Association and served as president of the Alabama Lawyers Association from 1992 to 1993. He is an elected member of the American Law Institute.

As a charter member of the West Jefferson Kiwanis Club, he served as its president and as a member of the board of directors. He also served as lieutenant governor, Alabama District of Kiwanis International, from 1991 to 1992.

Justice Cook, the second of three children of Joe and Nannie Cook, was born April 29, 1944, in Birmingham, Alabama. His father owned and operated Cook's Cleaners in Bessemer for over 67 years. His mother was a Jefferson County principal and teacher for over 43 years. Justice Cook is married to the former Charisie Davis, a native of Jefferson County, who serves as Dean of Students at Lawson State Community College. They are the parents of three children: Kimberly, Nakela, and Ralph, Jr.

Justice Cook and his family are members of the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church where he serves as an assistant superintendent and teacher in the Sunday school and is a member of the church trustee board.
