Shirley Cunningham, Jr.

Mr. Shirley Cunningham Jr. practices law in Lexington, Kentucky, where he is a managing partner of Cunningham and Grundy Law Group, specializing in personal injury, medical negligence, wrongful death, class actions, criminal law, bankruptcy, and social security. He practiced previously in Georgetown, Ky., and has also been a partner in the firm Berry and Cunningham in Lexington, KY.



Before opening his own practice in 1987, Mr. Cunningham served as vice president and general counsel for Bank One in Lexington. Earlier, he was an assistant county attorney for the Fayette County Attorney's Office, simultaneously teaching at the University of Kentucky as an assistant professor of agricultural economics. He has also been a television talk show producer and host for WLEX-TV in Lexington.

Mr. Cunningham is a member of the American Bar Association, the National Bar Association, and the Kentucky Bar Association. Other affiliations in his profession are the Association of Trial Lawyers of America, the Kentucky Academy of Trial Attorneys (as well as the academy's Advocate's Club), the National Association of Consumer Bankruptcy Attorneys, the Kentucky Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, and Phi Alpha Delta Legal Fraternity.

Serving as chairperson of the Robert N. Murrell Scholarship Fund Board of Directors for Tennessee State University, Mr. Cunningham also serves as general counsel for TSU's National Alumni Association. Since 1992, he has been selected as the minority caucus delegate from Kentucky by the Association of Trial Lawyers of America. In 2002, he was a presenter at the National Bar Association Convention and was honored with the Presidential Achievement Award.

Mr. Cunningham has served on the board of directors of numerous note-worthy organizations. He currently is a board member for the American Cancer Society of Fayette County, Florida A&M University, and the Shirley Allen Cunningham Jr. Family Foundation.

Shirley Cunningham holds a bachelor of science degree in rural development from Tennessee State University, a master of science degree in agricultural economics from the University of Missouri-Columbia, and a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Kentucky.

Jean Flagg-Newton

Jean Flagg-Newton, Ph.D., is chief of the Office of Health Disparities Research for the National Center on Minority Health and Health Disparities. In addition to developing diagnostics and therapies for disease in minority populations, the Office of Health Disparities conducts research to understand how environmental, socioeconomic, and cultural factors increase susceptibility to disease.



Dr. Flagg-Newton was previously interim deputy director for the National Center on Minority Health and Health Disparities. Prior to that, she was deputy director and coordinator for the Minority Health Initiative with the former Office of Research on Minority Health at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland. The Minority Health Initiative was a comprehensive program that focused on reducing the disproportionate burden of disease among minority populations and developing successful strategies to promote lifelong healthy behaviors.

Dr. Flagg-Newton began her career as a research associate and later became an assistant professor at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. In 1988, she joined the National Institute of General Medical Science at the National Institutes of Health. After a brief period as directorate of Environmental Engineering at Tinker Air Force Base in Oklahoma, she returned as a scientific review administrator. She later transferred to the NIH's Fogarty International Center, serving as director of the Minority International Research Training Program, a program that enables U.S. colleges and universities to support international training and research opportunities for U.S. underrepresented minorities in the scientific professions.

Dr. Flagg-Newton has received numerous awards including the NIH Director's Award for leadership, initiative, and enthusiasm in promoting excellence in elementary school science education through the Science Alliance Program and the Director's Award for meritorious performance. She is a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and has made exceptional contributions to the mission of NIH.

Dr. Flagg-Newton holds a baccalaureate degree from Tennessee State University in zoology. She earned a Ph.D. in physiology at Harvard University and pursued additional postdoctoral studies at the University of Miami School of Medicine.

Facts About Tennessee State University

- Tennessee State University is an economic powerhouse. According to TSU's Office of Business and Economic Research, the university had an economic impact on the greater Nashville area of nearly \$500 million in 2001-02. TSU created more than 9,000 jobs and attracted visitors who spent \$42.4 million.
- The university has experienced an explosion in sponsored research in recent years, reaching \$41.42 million in 2002 and making Tennessee State University one of the top five research universities in the state. The university has established a Center for Neural Engineering, a Center for Automated Space Science, and a myriad of other programs through sponsored research funding.
- Tennessee State University has officially opened the doors on its new state-of-the-art performing arts center, a \$9 million, 40,000-square-foot facility more than 10 years in the making. Part of the original \$112 million capital improvements project begun in 1988, the complex has a first-rate, high-tech theater, a refurbished and expanded rehearsal hall for the Music Department and TSU bands, and build-out space for radio and television studios.
- An astronomer at TSU was the first person in history to see evidence of a planet outside our solar system. In 1999, Greg Henry detected the planet through computers in downtown Nashville that are linked to telescopes in southern Arizona. The remote-control telescope is the largest of its kind in the world.
- Tennessee State University's Business Incubation Center has launched numerous small businesses in Tennessee, including Christie Cookies, which now has national sales through its web-site and eight-person sales force. TSU is one of only a few HBCUs in the nation to host a business incubation center.
- The university offers 43 bachelor's degrees and 26 master's degrees and confers doctoral degrees in six areas: biological sciences, computer information systems engineering, psychology, public administration, curriculum and instruction, and administration and supervision.
- Tennessee State University is home to two centers of excellence: the Center of Excellence for Research and Policy on Basic Skills and the Center of Excellence for Information Systems Engineering and Management. TSU is also home to the Samuel P. Massie Chair of Environmental Engineering, funded by the U.S. Department of Energy.
- Tennessee State University has a large and diverse student population. In 2002, there were nearly 9,000 students enrolled at TSU, representing 42 states and 52 countries.
- In 2000 TSU earned reaffirmation of its accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. In addition, various colleges, schools, and departments within the university are accredited by their respective organizations.
- Tennessee State University remains on the leading edge of technology, with a state-of-the-art campus and modern facilities. In 2000 and 2001, TSU was listed as one of the nation's top 100 "most wired" universities by the Internet search engine Yahoo!
- Tennessee State University has been listed for the past nine years among the national universities in the *U.S. News and World Report's* "Guide to America's Best Colleges."
