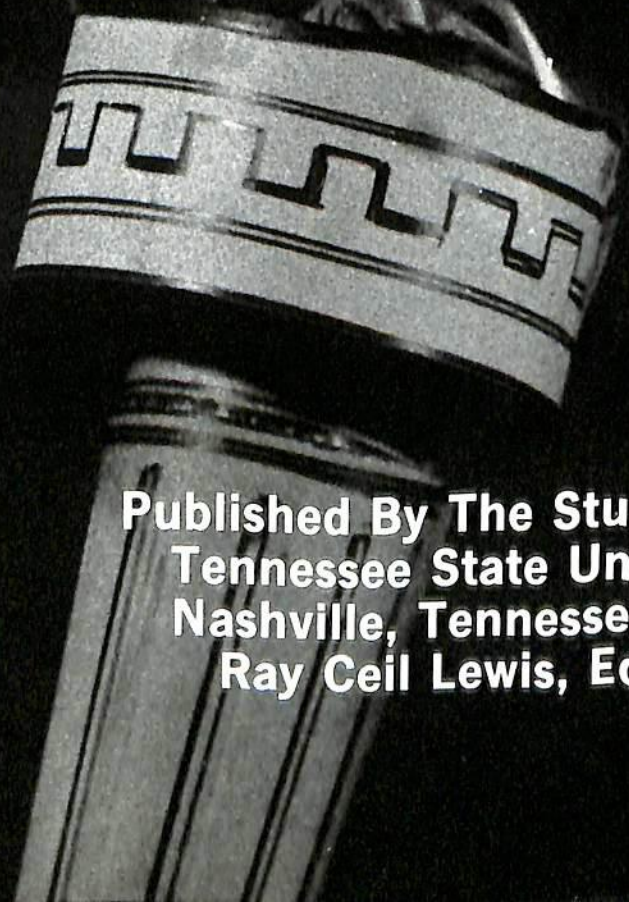

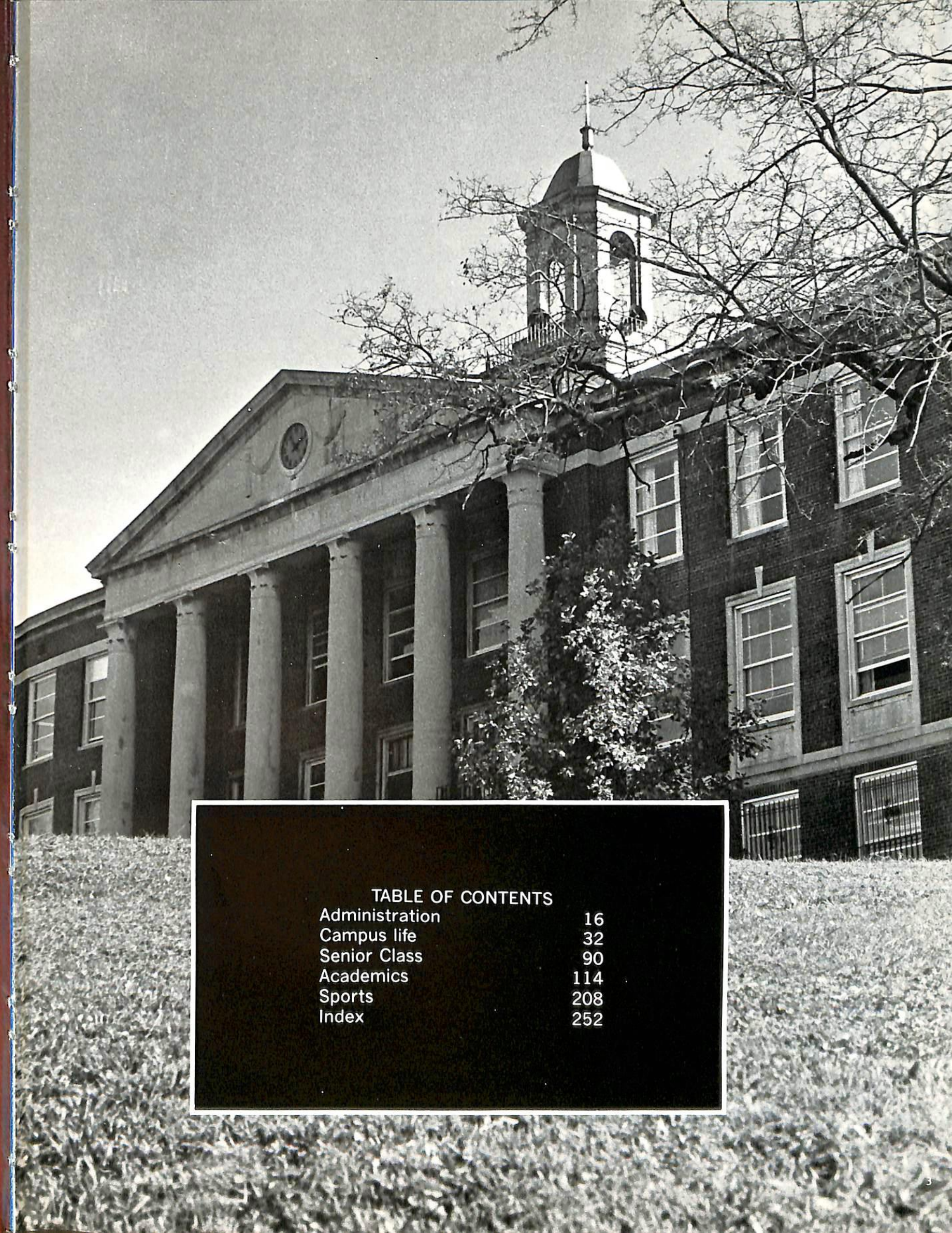


# T.S.U. THE TORCH OF ETERNITY.

The hand represents the strong foundation upon which T.S.U. was built.

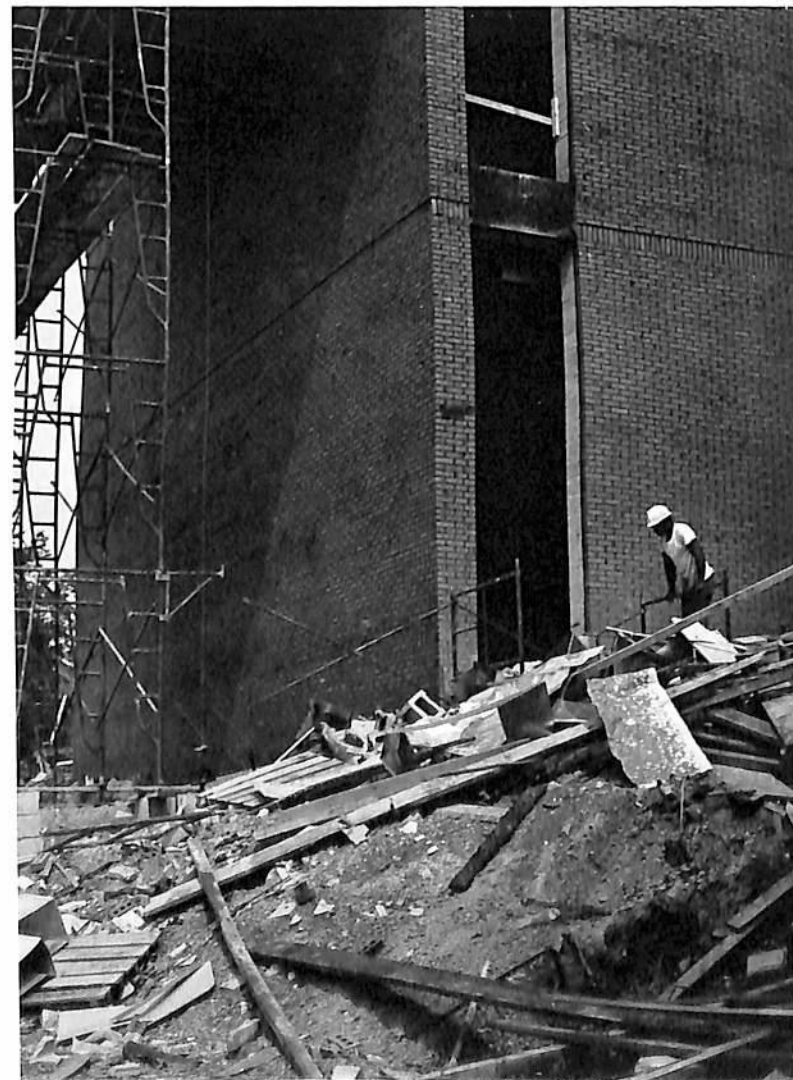

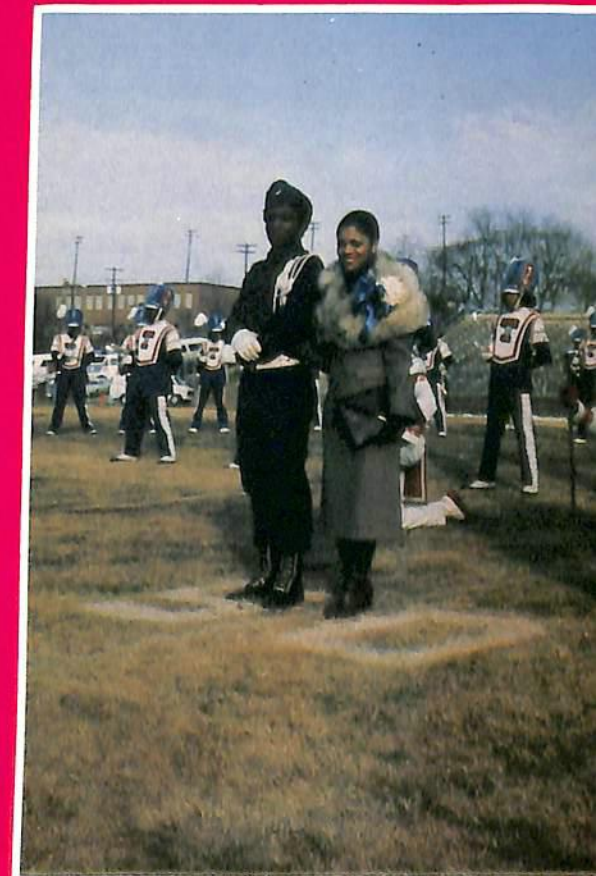

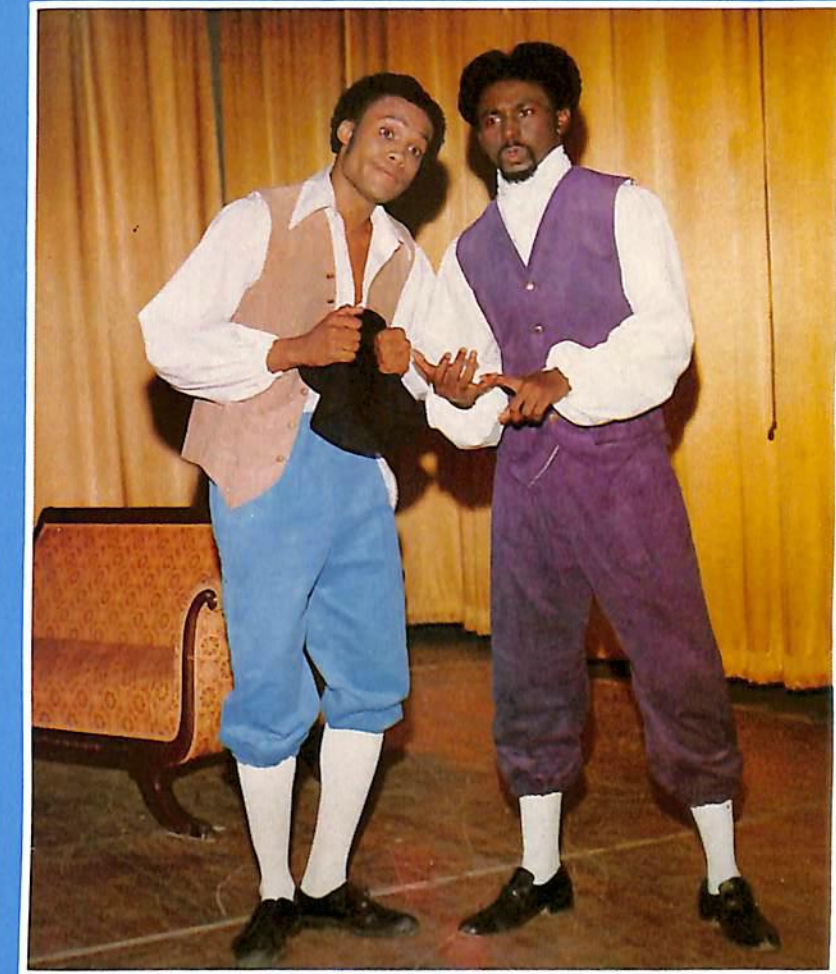

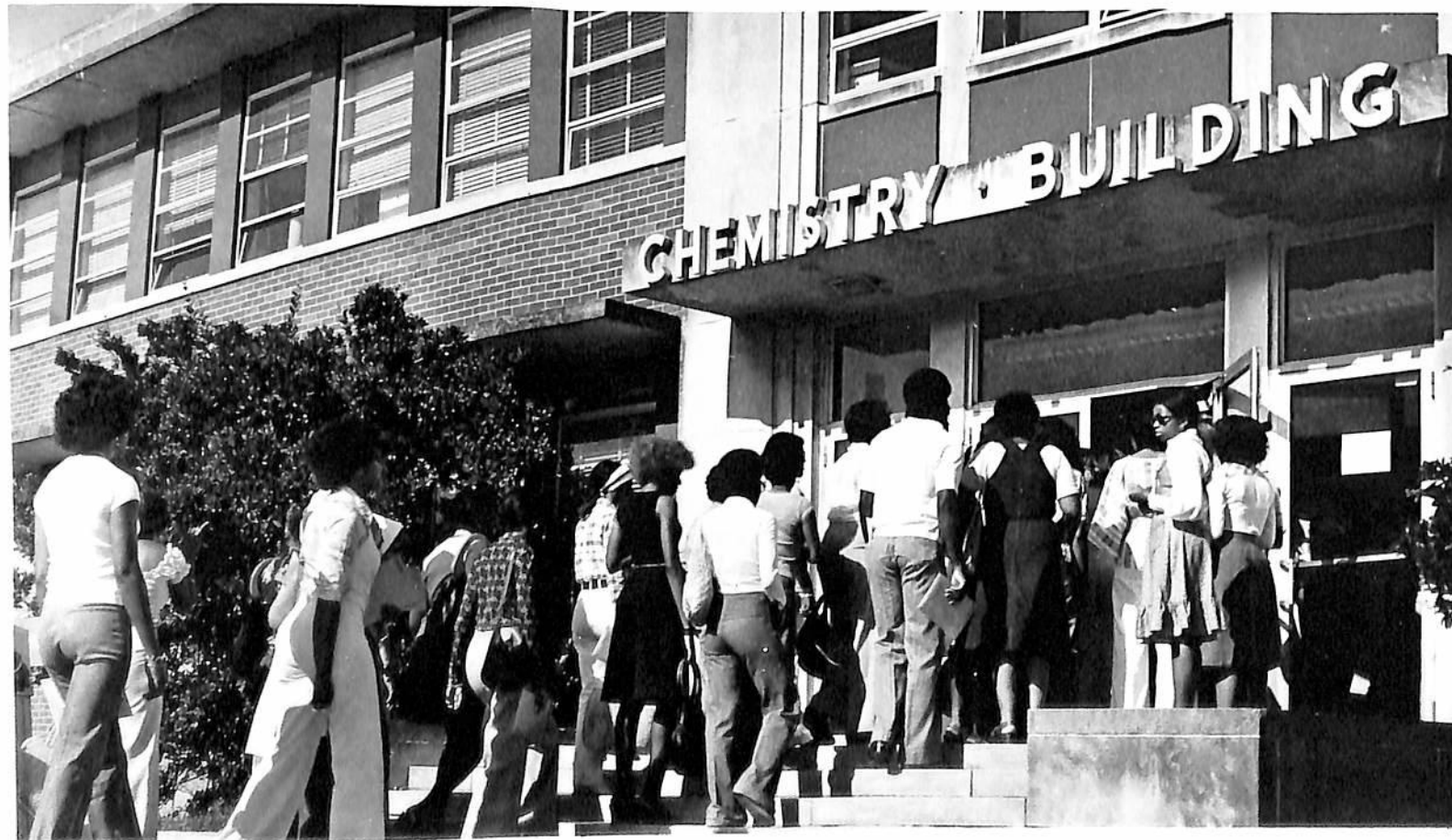

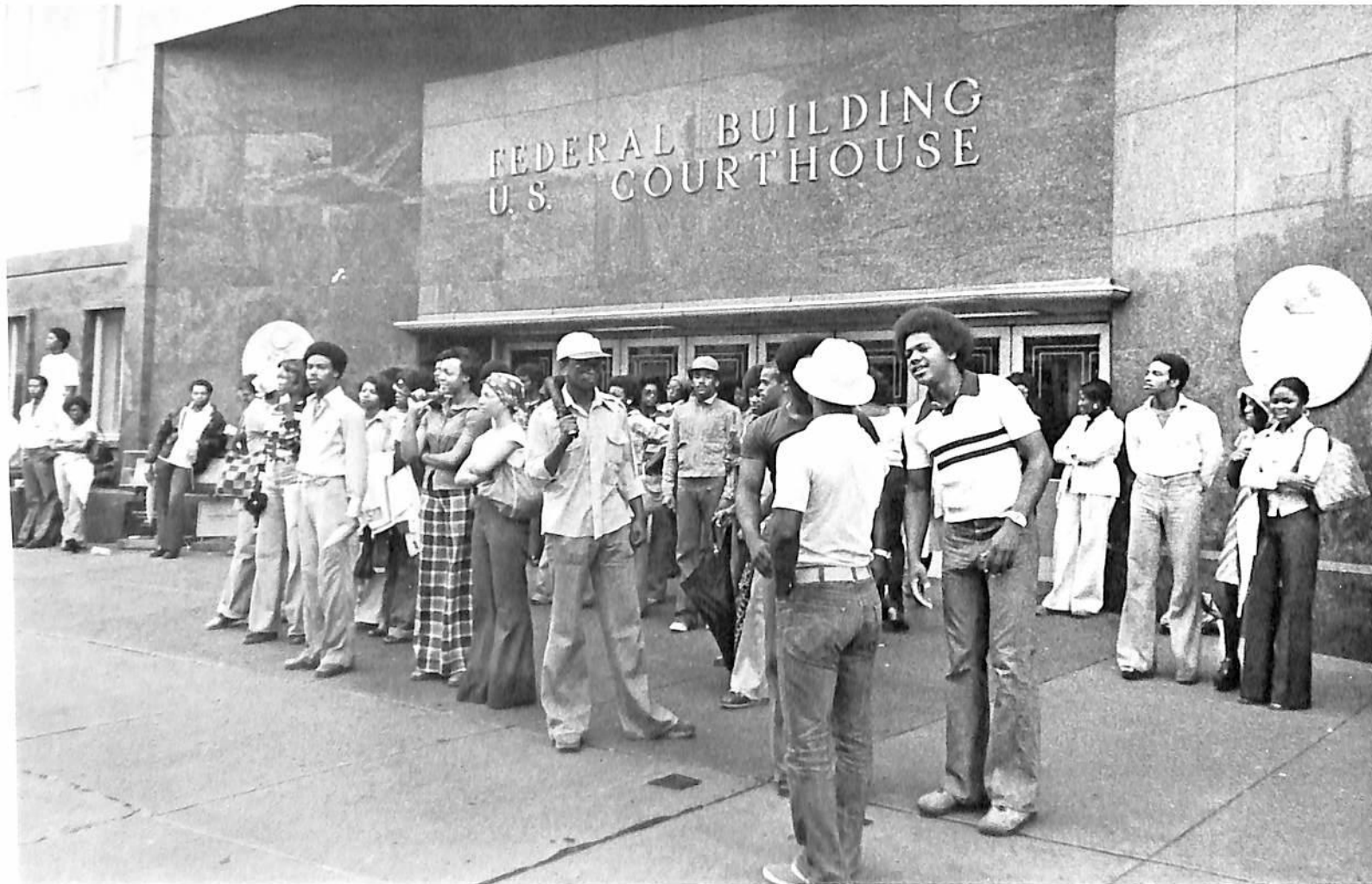




## ... TSU-UTN CONTROVERSY

The eight-year old TSU-UTN controversy finally went to trial before US. District Court Judge Frank Gray, Jr. in September, 1976. Students of the University, a month into the first semester of the school year, decided to keep tabs on the court's action, skipped classes, marched and held vigil in front of the Federal Building on Broadway.

Students held an orderly protest, but attracted a lot of attention with their home-made signs advocating that TSU be the only State University in Davidson County.

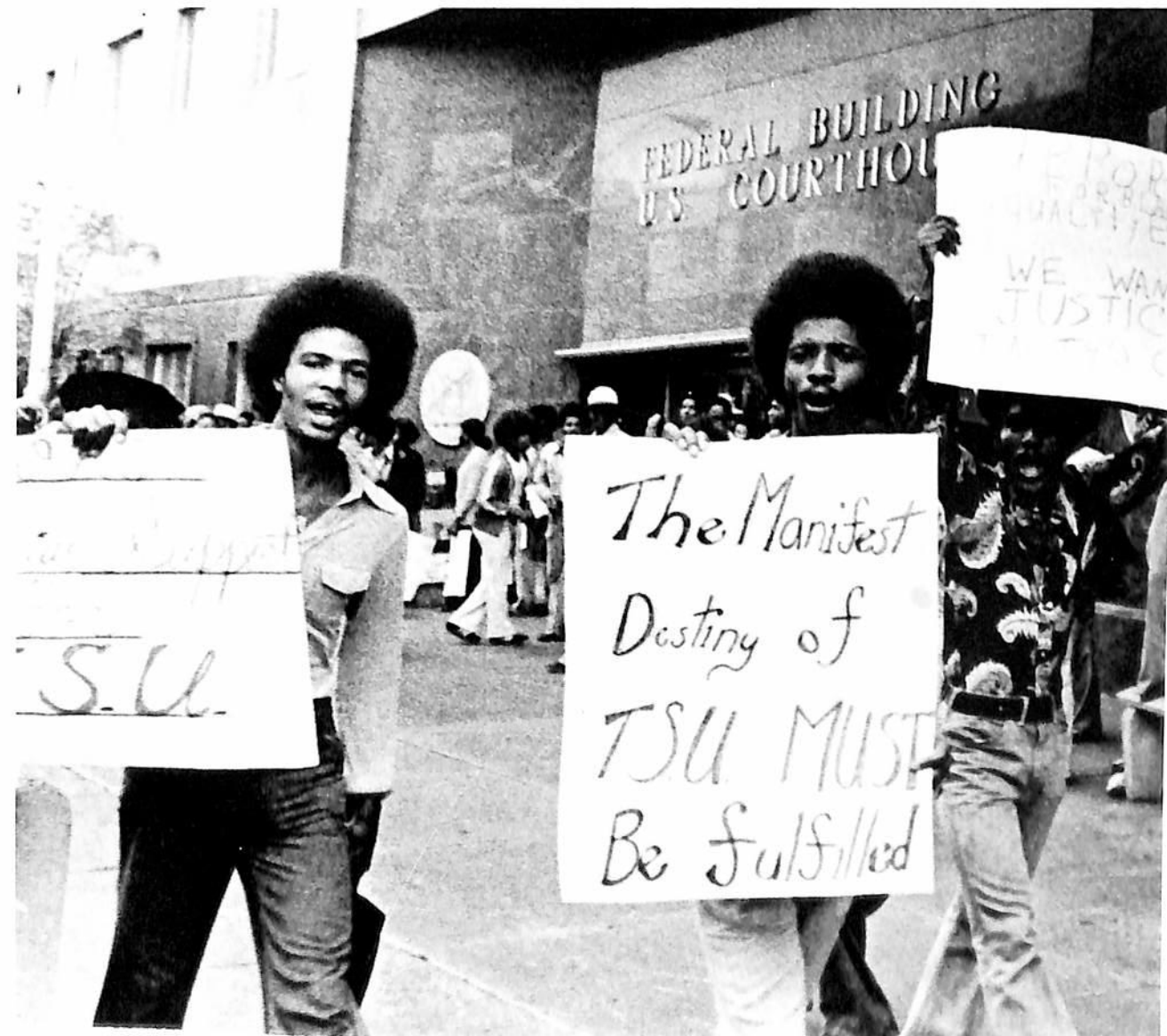

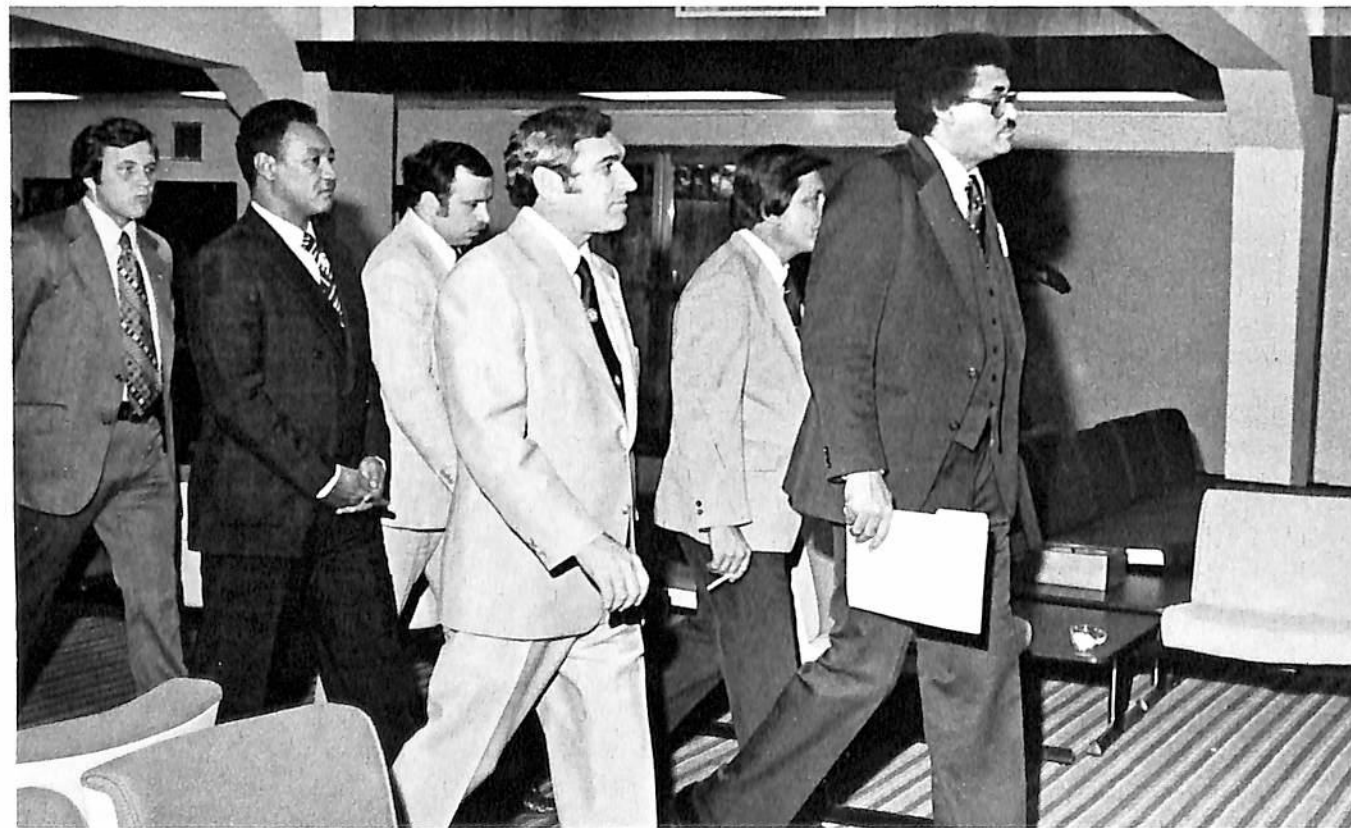


# A VISIT FROM THE PRESIDENT OF SUDAN

To be nominated for Who's Who Among Students In American Universities & Colleges, the student must be nominated by the head of his or her academic department.

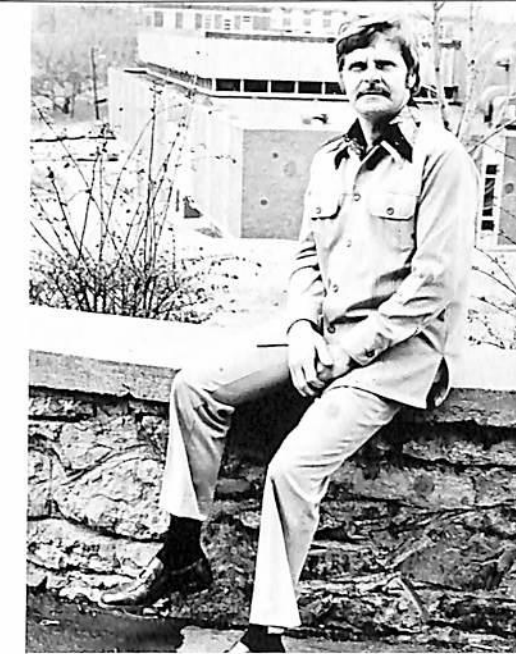

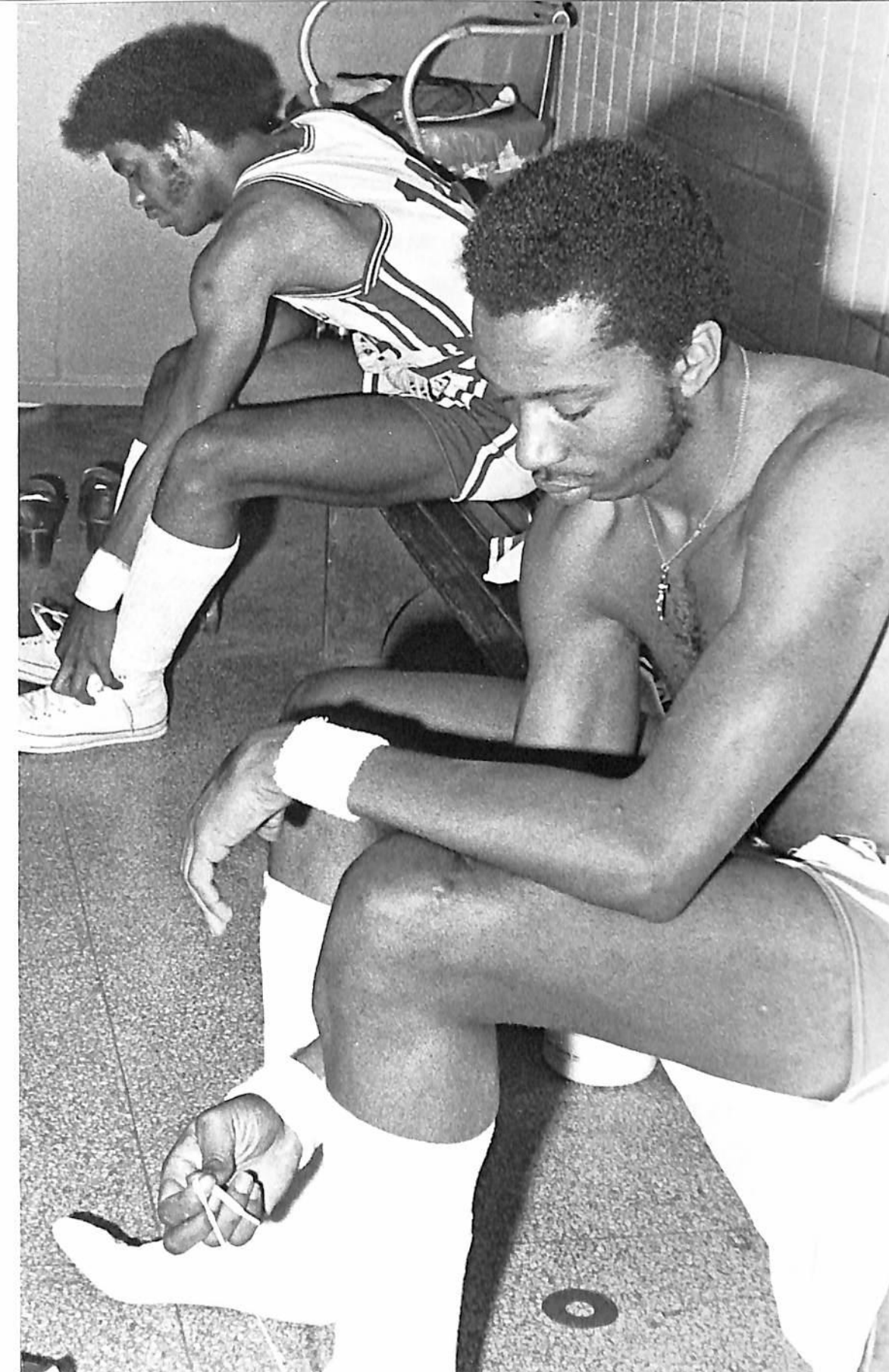
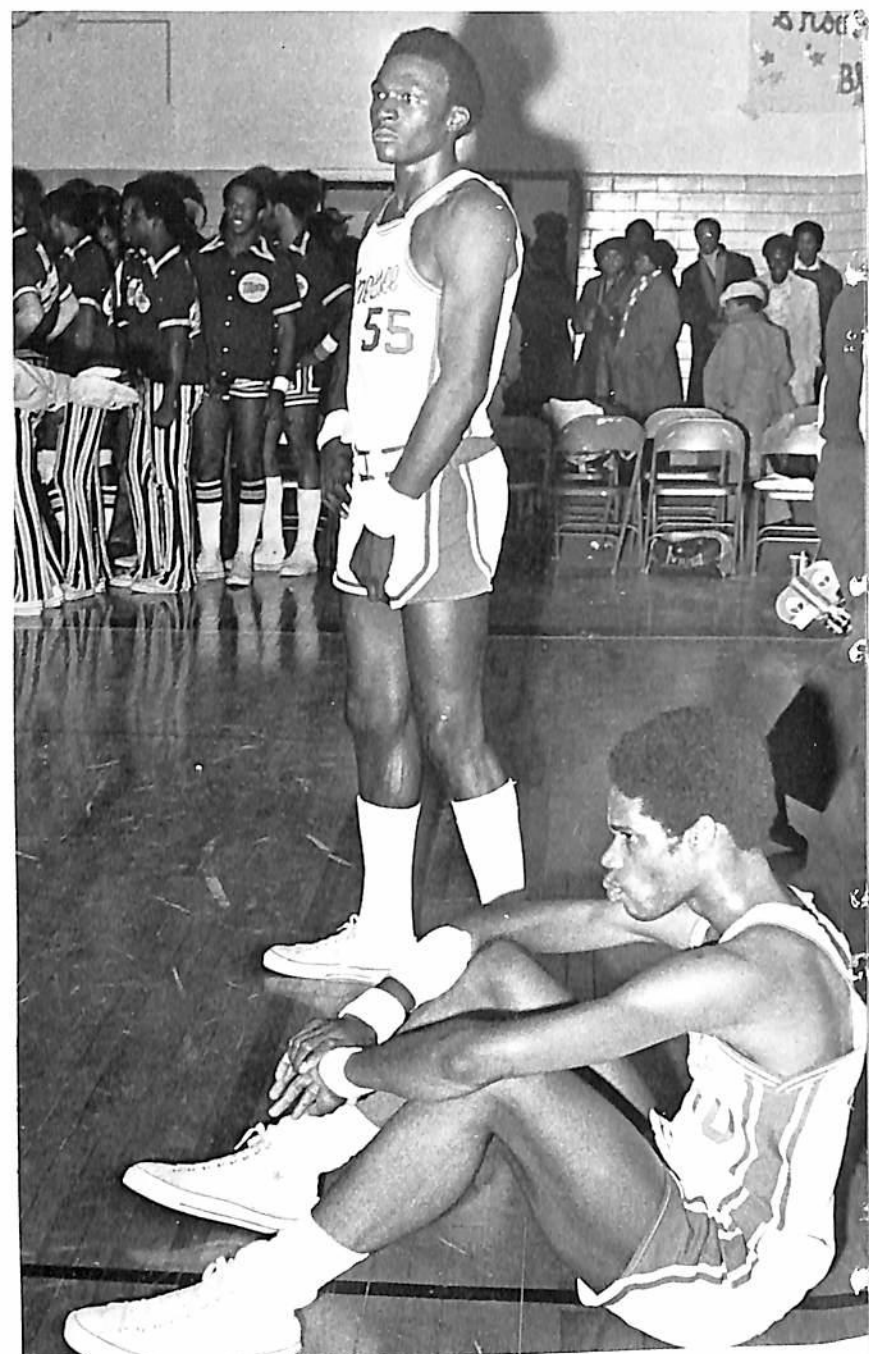






# WHAT A HASSLE!

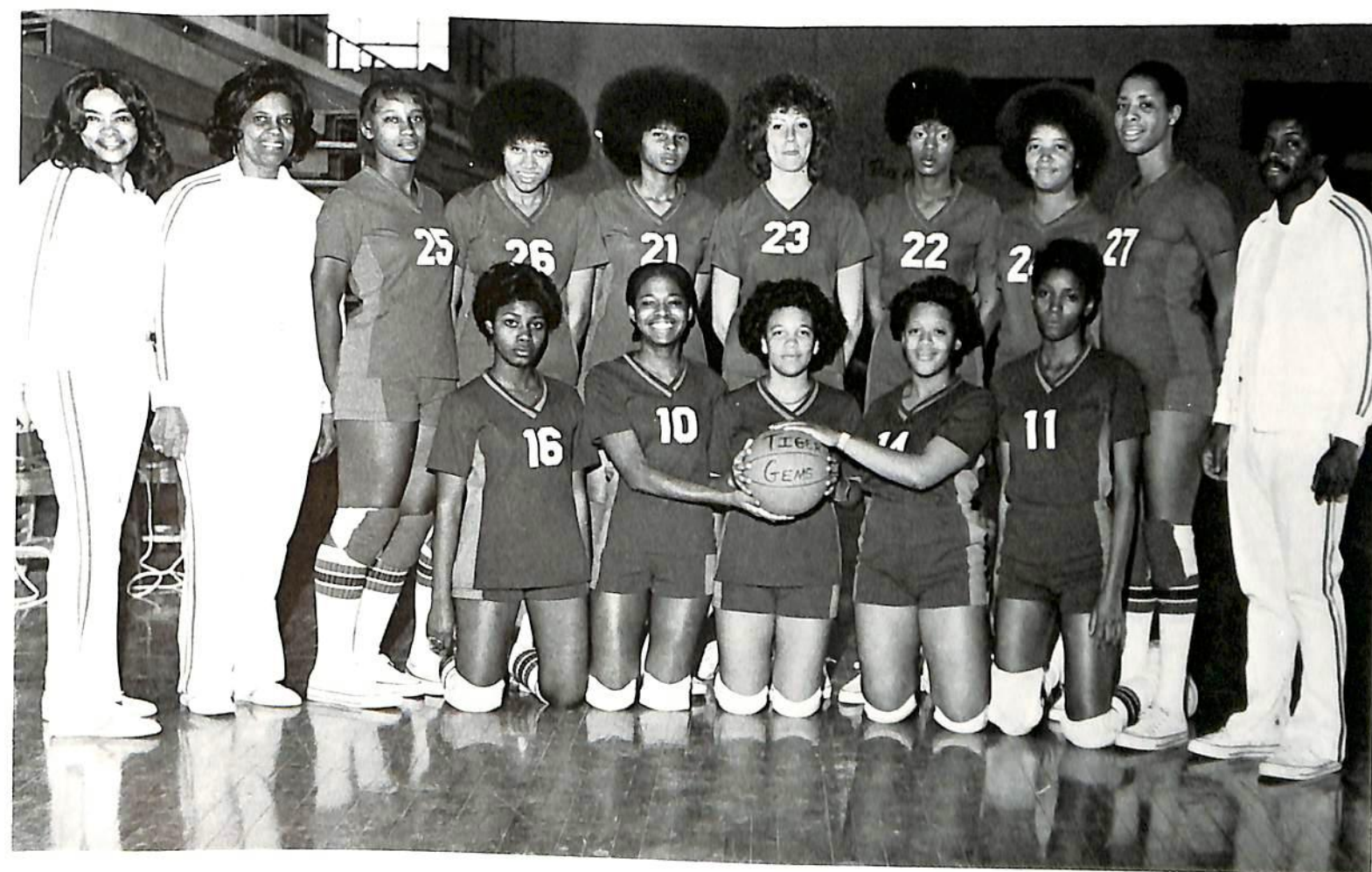
