These thoughts represent the 1970-71 school year at Tennessee State University—Moments of Togetherness, Moments of Activity, Moments of Study and Moments of Competition....






HEPERMOTS HOLD WEEKLY ACTIVITY NIGHTERS









NO LOSSES FOR BIG BLUE

Despite numerous question marks and uncertainties for the Big Blue Tigers at the inception of the 1970 season, that year's team will be recorded as one of the truly great ones in the annals of the University's intercollegiate football program. Coach John Merritt's 1969 team posted an outstanding record with its seven wins, one loss and one tie, but both the coaching staff and the everyday fans of the Big Blue were somewhat skeptical of the team's chances for the 1970 season. However, the Big Blue was fortunate enough to have returning lettermen.

With this nucleus of experienced performers, the Big Blue went on to post 11 wins against no losses, with their last win coming in the waning moments of a hard-fought contest with Southwestern Louisiana by a score of 26 to 25, in the Grantland Rice Bowl game.


In their initial game of the campaign, the Big Blue drew one of the toughest assignments any team could find in an opening game. Alcorn A & M was the foe in the Freedom Classic, which was played in the Los Angeles Coliseum. Alcorn, by virtue of a win over Grambling in the classic's inaugural in 1969, was rated a slight favorite over the Big Blue.

But the Big Blue, thanks to the accurate passing of Joe Gilliam, Jr., ran up a 21-0 lead by the halftime and held on with bulldog tenacity when the Alcorn team pushed over two touchdowns in the second half. Alfred Reese added a field goal in the fourth quarter to end the Tiger scoring. The final score was Tennessee State 24, Alcorn 14 and things went the same way throughout the remainder of the season.

Nine of the Tigers were drafted by professional teams—Vernon Holland, Cincinnati Bengals; Larry Woods, Detroit Lions; Jacob Mayes, San Diego Chargers; David Davis, Green Bay Packers; Fred Herring, Cincinnati Bengals; William West, Oakland Raiders; Albert Davis, Philadelphia Eagles; Don Pinson, San Diego Chargers; Joe Sweet, Los Angeles Rams.











HARDWOOD TIGERS POST BEST RECORD SINCE '57

The 1970-71 edition of the Big Blue Basketball Tigers proved to be one of the most colorful, exciting, and successful in the school's modern history. Rolling up an impressive 23-2 record in regular season play, and 25-3 in post season, the Tigers found themselves ranked as the number two team in the final UPI and AP small college polls and posted their best record since 1957.

With the tremendous schedule facing the Tigers, local followers gave them a 50-50 chance of completing a .500 season, facing toughies like Kentucky State, NAIA champs; Philadelphia Textile, the NCAA champs; Central State of Ohio, NAIA powerhouse; Southern Illinois University; Gannon College and Lincoln of Missouri. In all, the 25-game slate included eight teams that were in post season play the season before.

Opening the season on the road, the Tigers rolled up several victories enroute to the Quincy College tournament championship, with a stunning 89-85 upset over fourth ranked Oral Roberts University of Tulsa, Oklahoma. Lloyd Neal paced the Big Blue with 81 points in the three-game meet and ended up the tourney's most valuable player. All-American Ted McClain and Co-Captain Ron Dorsey joined Neal on the all-tourney team.

A highlight of the '70-'71 season was the rematch with Philadelphia Textile. Textile had defeated the Tigers for the NCAA national championship in March, 1970. The Tigers had waited 10 months for this opportunity and wasted little time in annihilating the Rams 85-67. Led by freshman sensation, Leonard Robinson's 29 points and 17 rebounds, the Big Blue had little trouble in handing the defending champs their first defeat.

Another highlight was the meeting of the number one and number three ranked teams nationally when Kentucky State College invaded Kean's Little Garden for a return match. The Thorobreds beat the Tigers earlier, on a last second lay-up by Jerome Brister, 91-89 in Frankfort. Before the largest crowd ever to see a basketball game in Kean Hall, it took a last second shot by Lloyd Neal to drop the number one Kentuckians 95-94 before all pandemonium broke loose in the Garden. It was described by the numerous pro scouts in attendance as the most exciting collegiate game ever played.

Conversation-piece game of the year was the Atlanta-held rematch with Ogelthorpe Colleae in which the latest in stalling tactics was used by the opponents. The Big Blue won it anyway and the final score was an unbelievable 7-4!

Rounding out the season was the second consecutive bid to the NCAA South Regional Tournament held in Lafayette, Louisiana, where the Tigers defeated Louisiana Tech 92-91 in overtime before dropping the championship game to host Southwestern Louisiana, 86-82, before 10,500 hostile Louisiana fans.

Key to the Tigers' season's end best record status was consistency and depth. Led by senior three-time All-American, Ted (The Hound) McClain from Nashville's Pearl High and UPI All-American junior pivot Lloyd Neal from Talbotton, Georgia, the Tigers outscored all opposition by averaging 92.3 points per game while holding opponents to 71.6 points per game. Supporting this dynamic duo were 6'4" senior Ron Dorsey at guard, 6'6" Robert Mathis and 6'6" freshman Leonard Robinson on the wings. The super




sixth man role was shared by Ron James at guard, Richard Rucker and James Edwards at wings and Al Alexander and Claude Grant in the post position. Big Lloyd Neal led all scorers with a 24.3 points per game average, followed by McClain with 22.4 points per game and 11 assist average. Ron Dorsey followed with 15.6 and freshman Len Robinson with 13.3.

At the season's end, the Big Blue found themselves with

a 25-3 record and two professional draftees and two All-Americans. Ted McClain was drafted in the first round by both the NBA and ABA. Senior Ron Dorsey was also drafted in the ABA. McClain was honored by making six All-American polls while junior standout and leading scorer, Lloyd Neal was chosen for the first team UPI All-American team. The Tigers will return 10 of its top 12 men for next season's competition.




Two Tigers out-jump Southern opponent for rebound.










Good Season for Tigerbelles Despite Budget Cut

Despite budget cutbacks that forced curtailment of some of their activities, Coach Ed Temple's Tigerbelles enjoyed one of their best seasons during the 1970-71 school year.

The Tigerbelles' "Big Gun" in the track wars was Iris Davis, a junior from Pompano Beach, Florida, whose performance during the 1970 outdoor season earned her the title, "North American Female Athlete of the Year." She was also named Female Athlete of the Year by Atlanta's 100% Wrong Club and placed fourth overall in the balloting for the coveted Sullivan Award.

Along with three other 'Belles—Martha Watson, Matiline Render, and Debbie Smith—Miss Davis qualified for the Temple-coached United States Track Team that toured Europe during the summer. During two months of competition in Germany, the Soviet Union, Rumania, France, Finland, Sweden, Norway, and England, she won every single event entered.

The Tigerbelles started their 1971 indoor season at the Philadelphia Track Classic January 22 and wound it up at the Knights of Columbus Meet in Cleveland, Ohio, March 19. During the eight meets of the indoor season, Miss Davis once again went undefeated.

In the annual Dogwood Relays at the University of Tennessee, that marked the opening of the Tigerbelles' outdoor season, Debbie Wedgeworth won the long jump with a leap of 19 ft.-11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., Diane Waters jumped 5 ft., 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. to win the high jump and Miss Davis won the 100 yard dash in 10.5 seconds, setting a new Dogwood Relays record in the process. Then the Tigerbelle 880-yard relay team, with Debbie Smith, Miss Wedgeworth and Pat Hunter running the first three legs and Miss Davis running the anchor leg, broke the American record in the event as they took first place with a time of one minute, 37.5 seconds.

The Tigerbelles' home track at Hale Stadium was the scene for a Pan-American game development meet that attracted athletes from all over North and South America, including future Tigerbelle, Mamie Rallings of Chicago's Mayor Daley Track Club.


























