The College of Liberal Arts invites students to apply to enroll in a study abroad course for Summer Session I 2017. The course is a study of African-American Literature using a Black Feminist lens. Students will read critical works from Black feminist theorists and use this critical framework to examine the historical contexts that have led



African-American men and women to travel abroad to resist various levels of oppression in the United States.

Class will begin on the Tennessee State University main campus. It will continue for two weeks in Paris, and the final week will take place on the Tennessee State University main campus. Enrollment in the course is limited to 10 students. Perspective students should submit a completed application by Friday, 18 November 2016. Applications should include the following

- 1. A one page statement of interest (Word Document) explaining:
 - a. interest in the course
 - b. preparation for study abroad opportunity
 - c. how taking the course would enhance the student's educational experience
- 2. A letter of support from a tenured or tenure-track faculty emailed to Intersectinglives2017@gmail.com
- 3. GPA of 3.0 or higher

In addition, students should be prepared for a brief interview. Applicants should be prepared to pay for the cost of the tuition and fees for the course and other expenses. Applicants should also note that in order to enroll in the course and travel abroad they must have a current passport. Additionally, at the time of application students must have earned 30 credit hours.
