

## Blacks in Europe: The Case of Nella Larsen Study Abroad in Copenhagen Denmark: Maymester 2019 Applications due: October 26, 2018 by 4pm

The Languages, Literature, and Philosophy department invites students to apply to enroll in a study abroad course for Maymester 2019. The course is a study of the Harlem Renaissance writer Nella Larsen. Students will read her two novellas, *Quicksand* (1928) and *Passing* (1929), and use Black feminist theory to

examine the historical contexts that have led African-American men and women to travel abroad to resist various levels of oppression in the United States.

Class will begin on the Tennessee State University main campus and continue in Copenhagen, Denmark. Enrollment in the course is limited to 10 students. Perspective students should submit a completed application by Friday, 26 October 2018. Applications should include the following:

- 1. A one page statement of interest (Word Document) explaining:
  - a. interest in the course
  - b. preparation for study abroad opportunity
  - c. how taking the course would enhance the student's educational experience
- 2. A letter of support from a tenured or tenure-track faculty emailed to LarsenAbroad2018@hotmail.com
- 3. GPA of 3.0 or higher

In addition, students should be prepared for a brief interview. Applicants should be prepared to pay for the cost of the tuition and fees for the course and other expenses. Applicants should also note that in order to enroll in the course and travel abroad they must have a current passport. Additionally, at the time of application students must have earned 30 credit hours.

A limited number of scholarships are available to cover the cost of the experience.
