<u>Grammy Award Winning Musician to</u> <u>Visit TSU</u>



French jazz pianist, composer, arranger and record producer, Cedric Hanriot, will visit TSU on Tuesday, March 26. Mr. Hanriot is a member of the American School of Modern Music. He is featured on the album Beautiful Life, which received the Grammy award for best jazz vocal album in 2015. He has performed at Jazz a Vienne, Opera Nouvel, Tanglewood Jazz Festival, Jarasum International Jazz Festival, and La Defense Jazz Festival. Mr. Hanriot has worked with Dianne Reeves, Herbie Hancock, Terri Lyne Carrington, and John Patitucci, to name a few.

Popular singer Jimmie Herrod will appear along with Cedric Hanriot. Mr. Herrod is a singer, songwriter, and entertainer. Mr Herrod was a finalist on "America's Got Talent" and received the Golden Buzzer recognition from actress Sofia Vargara. He is comfortable singing in numerous languages and musical styles.

Messers Hanriot and Herrod will lead a masterclass in the Recital Hall, located in the Performing Arts Building, on Thursday, March 26 at 1:30 p.m. The event is open to the public.


News from Dr. Tem
