The Career Mobility plan is designed to allow RNs to advance their careers. It also recognizes the RNs previous learning and current clinical experiences.

#### <u>RN-BSN Program</u> Admission Requirements

- Admission to the University
- A current unencumbered Tennessee RN license
- A cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Completion of 60 credit hours of lower division courses including general education courses
- A minimum grade of "C" in each course (Required courses, with grades of "D", must be repeated before review for admission)

#### Process for Admission to the RN-BSN Program

- Application materials must be submitted to the BSN office by March 15th. The Admissions Committee will only consider students who have submitted their completed application by the posted date. Applications received after the deadline will be returned to the applicants who can apply for the next admission cycle.
- A complete admissions packet should include:
  - a. School of Nursing application
  - b. TSU admission letter for new and newly readmitted students
  - c. Copy of all college transcripts
  - d. Copy of current TSU transcript (if enrolled at the University)
  - e. Copy of current RN license
