Psychology majors interested in working in government may consider completing coursework in political science, sociology, and urban studies and pursuing a **Master's degree in Public Policy or Public Administration**.

Psychology majors with an interest in health and social justice may consider pursuing a **Master's degree in Public Health**. A career in Public Health offers opportunities to work locally or globally in specialties including using social and behavioral sciences to address problems including maternal and child health, obesity and nutrition, epidemiology, and human rights.
