NURSING—ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE IN NURSING ACADEMIC MAP: DEGREE AAS (60 CREDIT HOURS)

This degree map is a semester-by-semester course schedule for students majoring in Nursing with a concentration in Associate of Applied Science in Nursing. The milestones listed to the right of each semester are designed to keep a student on track to graduate in two years. The schedule serves as a general guideline to help build a full schedule each semester. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progression to complete a major.

Missing milestones will result in one or two registration stops. First registration stop occurs if a student misses a milestone in a pre-requisite and/or co-requisite course(s). Students are expected to repeat all failed pre-requisite or co-requisite course(s) during the semester immediately following that in which the grades were earned. Students have to be admitted to the AASN Program before you are allowed to take nursing course (s). All nursing students take the same courses in sequence. Second registration stop occurs if a student misses a milestone in (nursing course and/or GPA). The student has to submit a letter to the Director of AASN Program requesting readmission to the course. The letter will be submitted to the Progression and Retention Committee for recommendation. If a student is non-compliant with milestones for two consecutive nursing courses, students will not be allowed to progress in the program. Students will be referred to an advisor to assist with a change of major.

The AASN major is a limited access major. Students interested in applying to the nursing program must apply by March 1st. The minimum GPA requirement to apply for admission is 2.5 overall GPA. Each applicant must take the preentrance nursing examination through the TSU Testing Center prior to submitting the application and earn the minimum scores in each section/composite. Students are strongly encouraged to complete all pre and co-requisite general education courses before admission to the program. All science courses must be completed within five years of admission with a "C" or better. Students must pass all nursing courses prerequisites and major courses with a grade of "C" or better.
