

**Assessment and Improvement Committee**

**Educational Programs and Student Learning**

**Charge of the Committee:**

1. Provide leadership in the review, evaluation, and use of data for continuous improvement and accountability for student learning and program assessment plans.
2. Ensure consensus about what the institution expects students to represent or demonstrate along the continuum of their learning.
3. Use the assessment results to verify student learning and to identify patterns of strengths and weaknesses in order to improve teaching and learning.
4. Provide an annual report to the Vice President for Academic Affairs documenting changes, strengths, and weaknesses of student learning outcomes.
5. Disseminate results of student learning in academic areas in order to use assessment to inform the strategic planning process.

**Functions:**

The Assessment and Improvement Committee on Educational Programs and Student Learning fulfills an advisory and monitoring role regarding educational program assessment matters. The committee's work supports activities pertaining to SASCOC standards of student learning outcomes and does not supplant the work of existing committees with a target role in assessment (e.g., General Education committee) or the work of discipline-specific accreditation committees. The committee's responsibilities: assist with the coordination of assessment activities, completion/review of the **Program Assessment Evaluation Rubric** to ensure each academic program assessment report reflects workability and clarity, recommends strategies for evaluative improvement, completes the **Use of Results Audit**, completes the **Annual Appraisal of Assessments Report**, and submits recommendations to the Vice President for Academic Affairs.
