-The Center for Media Arts and Production is producing many programs including dozens for the HBCU radio network. Professors Winston and Stein are producing programs.


-Professors Richie and Idoye are in discussions for working on a project in Nigeria, result is that a university there is looking to him to establish a theatre & broadcasting program.
