Use appropriate terminology, conceptual frameworks, and reference authorities in the field when necessary. <u>The actual exam is scenario-based (six hours in length), and you will not have access to references, notes or the internet, so plan your time accordingly.</u>

Area A: Foundations of Higher Education

1. Discuss the historical development of higher education in the United States and its impact on current practices and policies. (**350-400** words)

2. Analyze the role of various stakeholders (e.g., students, faculty, administrators, and policymakers) in shaping the mission and purpose of higher education institutions. (350-400 words)

3. Examine the philosophical and theoretical foundations of higher education, and discuss their relevance to contemporary issues and challenges facing the field. (350-400 words)

4. Evaluate the impact of globalization and technological advancements on the future of higher education, and propose strategies for adapting to these changes. (350-400 words)

Area B: Organization and Administration

1. Compare and contrast the governance structures of public and private higher education institutions, and discuss the advantages and challenges of each model. (350-400 words)

2. Examine the role of strategic planning in higher education administration and its importance in achieving institutional goals and objectives. (350-400 words)

3. Analyze the importance of shared governance in higher education, and discuss strategies for promoting collaboration and communication among different stakeholder groups. (350-400 words)
