President Glover: July 1 funding cycle begins; there is an account we draw down from and is over 4 years; it is not 250 million in cash; 20 million per year in deferred maintenance for the electrical grid. She wants to meet with Dr. Young-Seigler soon to discuss it.

9 4:40 Report from TSU Board Meeting-March 17, 2022, Dr. Bill Johnson, Faculty Trustee Chairman Triplett: June 16, 2022 is the next board meeting

Trustee Johnson: Academic Affairs and Student Affairs committee met and approved 8 changes to curriculum or admission standards. SACSCOC has a monitoring report about finances is due September 8; 2026 is the 5 year report.

Housing applications as of March 2022, is at 1372 students (700 spaces in the new dorm). 65% of all undergrads live in on campus housing at TSU.

Audit Committee report: Foundation issues with bank reconciliation and title 4 funds and direct loans. Bank reconciling was off by over 1 million at one point and now is only 138K off.

As of the beginning of the Fall, there was student tuition and housing debt from 2019 back and did not allow for CARES money and HERF money and was 29 million(uncollected) . This year we wrote off 12 million dollars which is the most we can do and next year write off 12 million and 5 million the next year. We were not at zero budget due to this 29 million dollars of uncollected debt.

Work study students were tested as a sample and 47% do work during their scheduled class times (federal violation). 30% worked more than 20 hours per week, 15% worked more than 6 hours per day, 10% had overestimates of payments. Work study students needs to be better monitored. Recommendation to put departments on probation and withdraw work study money for a period of time for that department.

Fair Funding: 4 percent pay increase for state employees and the state does not fund thisthey fund 2.5 percent and no money for benefit changes. Last year we got 4 percent and the university put in 1.5%; of all sister institutions, were the only ones to get 4%.

In regards to the budget, January had 136 million revenue for the year. Expenses were 76 million in half the year. Instructional cost 23 million (31% of total percent of the total expenses) not 50% and tuition and fees was 58% of total income.

Last year institutional cost for AY 20-21 was 42%; VP budget and finance wants it to be 50 % or more and we are a business and our main product is instruction, not student affairs. Travel card policy; more info to come.

CARES and HERF money: as of February 2022, we have received \$115MILLION and we sent \$108 MILLION; WE HAVE UNTIL June 2023 to spend the money. Ballpark figures for how the money have been spent:

40 million on scholarships for students

49 million covering revenue costs (student debt) (not the 29 million unrecoverable debt)

13 million to cash to students above and beyond tuition

2 million technology and laptops

2.7 million equipment and supplies

Construction: negotiating with insurance companies for tornado damage

New Food sciences building on hold due to 3 million high on estimated budget

Other buildings discussed: new athletics support and operations building, pre-engineering building with 4.2 million estimate.

Enrollment head count: Fall 20 to spring 21- 21.9 percent drop
