Charles A. Traughber is the Associate General Counsel, Real Estate for Bridgestone Americas, Inc. He manages a team of attorneys and paralegals that assist Bridgestone with real estate, construction, and environmental matters for its North American operations consisting of approximately 3,000 owned and leased properties, including nearly 2,200 retail locations and various office, manufacturing, warehousing and distribution facilities.
