## Dr. Glenda Glover

Dr. Glenda Glover is Dean of the School of Business at Jackson State University in Jackson, Mississippi. She is a certified public accountant and an attorney, and holds a Ph.D. in economics and finance. Prior to joining Jackson State, Dr. Glover served as chairperson of the Department of Accounting at Howard University. She also has served previously as senior vice president and chief financial officer of an engineering firm, a tax manager at Potomac Electric Power Company, and an accountant with the firm Arthur Anderson & Company.



Dr. Glover is known as an economic development specialist and has performed numerous national market studies. She has been nationally recognized for her research pertaining to minority business development and is regarded as one of the nation's experts on empowerment zones. She has provided economic insight into major legislative issues for members of Congress, and has lectured to such organizations as the Congressional Black Caucus, the American Accounting Association and the National Bar Association. She serves on several boards of directors, including Citibank Corporation (Student Loan Subsidiary), the Harvard Business School of Management Alliance, and the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business. She also is a board member of the MetroJackson Chamber of Commerce and the NAACP, and is chair of the City of Jackson Planning Board.

After earning a bachelor of science degree in mathematics from Tennessee State University, Dr. Glover received a master of business administration degree in accounting from Clark Atlanta University. She received her Ph.D. from George Washington University, and later completed the doctor of juris prudence degree at Georgetown University.

## Facts About *Tennessee State University*

- Tennessee State University offers 43 bachelor's degrees and 26 master's degrees, and awards doctoral degrees in five areas: biological sciences, psychology, public administration, curriculum and instruction, and administration and supervision.
- Tennessee State University's enrollment has climbed consistently in recent years, reaching more than 8,600 in 1997. Enrollment in the Tennessee State University School of Graduate Studies and Research has increased by approximately 80 percent in the last five years.
- Tennessee State University's College of Business holds accreditation from the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). TSU is the only institution in Nashville to hold AACSB accreditation at both the undergraduate and graduate levels and is one of fewer than 24 percent of colleges nationwide to have earned the accreditation.
- Tennessee State University boasts an eminently qualified faculty, 74.3 percent of whom hold the doctorate or terminal degree in their field.
- Tennessee State University is home to two centers of excellence: the Center of Excellence for Research and Policy on Basic Skills and the Center of Excellence for Information Systems Engineering and Management.
- Tennessee State University is a major producer of African-American engineers. In the past 11 years, eight TSU engineering graduates have earned awards in various categories through the Black Engineer of the Year program, sponsored by *U.S. Black Engineer* magazine.
- Tennessee State University is the only higher education institution in Nashville to have a chapter of Phi Kappa Phi, the most prestigious honor society encompassing scholars from all disciplines.
- For the past three years, Tennessee State University has been listed among the best national universities in *U. S. News & World Report's* annual "Guide to America's Colleges and Universities."
- The Tennessee State University marching band, the Aristocrat of Bands, has participated in three presidential inaugural parades, one for President Kennedy and two for President Clinton.
- Tennessee State University is an Olympic tradition. Since 1950, track athletes from TSU have won 29 Olympic medals—16 gold, eight silver and five bronze, more than most countries have won. Of the 40 famed Tigerbelles (members of the TSU women's track team) who competed in the Olympics, 39 graduated from college with one or more degrees.
- Tennessee State University houses The Frist Chair of Excellence in the College of Business, funded in part by the State of Tennessee, and a Chair of Environmental Engineering, funded by the Office of Naval Research.
