## Earl G. Graves

Earl G. Graves is the chairman and chief executive officer of Earl G. Graves, Ltd., parent corporation for the Earl G. Graves Publishing Company, publisher of *Black Enterprise* magazine—a business-service publication targeted to black professionals, executives, entrepreneurs and policy makers in the public and private sectors. *Black Enterprise* has a guaranteed circulation of more than 425,000 with a readership of more than 3.3 million. In 1997, the magazine was chosen from among nearly 400 entrants to win the FOLIO: 1996 Editorial Excellence Award for Business/Finance.



He has served as chairman and CEO of Pepsi-Cola of Washington, D.C., L.P., the largest minority-controlled Pepsi-Cola franchise in the United States. Graves acquired the \$60 million franchise in July of 1990. The company covers a franchise territory of more than 400 square miles, including Washington, D.C., and Prince George's County, Maryland. In 1998, he sold the franchise back to the parent company, where he continues to be a significant stockholder and is chairman of Pepsi's Customer Advisory and Ethnic Marketing Committee.

Graves serves as a director of Aetna Life and Casualty Company, The Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture, AMR Corporation (American Airlines), DaimlerChrysler AG Corporation, Federated Department Stores, Inc., and Rohm & Haas Corporation. In addition, he serves as a volunteer on the boards of TransAfrica Forum and the American Museum of Natural History and Planetarium.

In 1999, Graves received the 84<sup>th</sup> NAACP Spingarn Medal, the organization's highest achievement award for African Americans, and was named one of the Top 100 Business News Luminaries of the Century by *TJFR*, a publication that covers business journalism. In that same year, he also received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Caribbean Tourism Organization.

Graves is a member of the National Black College Hall of Fame and has lectured at Yale University as a Poynter Fellow. He received his B.A. degree in economics from Morgan State University in Baltimore, and has received honorary degrees from 45 universities, including his alma mater. An ROTC graduate, he attended Airborne and Ranger School and finished his Army Career (at the rank of captain) as a member of the 19th Special Forces Group -- the Green Berets. He is a recipient of the U.S. Army Commendation Award.

Graves is a staunch advocate of higher education and equal opportunity. In recognition of his support of entrepreneurial education and his many years of contributing to Morgan State University, including a \$1 million gift to advance business education, the University renamed its school of business and management the Earl G. Graves School of Business and Management.

## Reginald Stuart

Reginald Stuart has been a journalist for more than 30 years, starting as a general assignment reporter in 1968 at the Nashville *Tennessean*, his hometown newspaper.

Early in his career he was a television and radio news reporter in Nashville and free-lanced for two years for a variety of regional publications in the South focusing on politics, race and the media, education and civil rights.



Stuart joined the *New York Times* in 1974 as a business and finance reporter based in New York. In 1976, he moved to the *Times'* national desk as a correspondent. Over the next eight years, he served as correspondent and bureau chief in Detroit, Atlanta and Miami. During that time, he covered a wide range of stories including the Chrysler Corporation bailout by the federal government, the Cleveland municipal default, the Haitian immigrant crisis and the Atlanta missing and murdered children investigation. He moved to the *Times'* Washington Bureau in 1984. There, he covered deregulation of the nation's broadcast, telephone, airline and railroad industries.

In 1987, Stuart joined Knight Ridder Newspapers as national affairs correspondent for the *Philadelphia Daily News*. In that assignment, he covered the 1988 presidential contests and the 1990 Census. In 1990, he was appointed assistant news editor in Knight Ridder's Washington Bureau, a post he held until leaving in 1996. Two months later, Stuart returned to Knight Ridder as corporate recruiter, working with the company's 32 papers to identify talent for newsroom and business positions.

While talent scouting has taken most of his time, Stuart continues to write; two books being published this fall include writings by Stuart. One focuses on race in Nashville at the turn of the century. The other, a compilation of news stories that have made a difference, includes portions of his writings on Kemba Smith, a young woman sentenced to 24 years in prison under federal mandatory sentencing guidelines with no chance for parole, despite being a first-time, non-violent offender. (Stuart's articles on Smith over the past five years are credited with persuading former President Bill Clinton to grant clemency to Smith in December 2000.) Stuart is author of a book on the Chrysler bailout and was contributing writer to *Counterattack*, a book published in Japan about American response to Japanese competition.

Stuart graduated from Tennessee State University in 1968 with a B.S. in sociology. He earned a master's degree in journalism from Columbia University in New York in 1971. He is a past national president of The Society of Professional Journalists and winner of its Wells Key, the highest honor bestowed by the organization for service to journalism.

Tennessee State University**

- In 2000 TSU earned reaffirmation of its accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. In addition, various colleges, schools and departments within the university are accredited by their respective organizations.
- Tennessee State University remains on the leading edge of technology, with a state-of-the art campus and facilities. In 2000, TSU was listed as one of the nation's top 100 "most wired" universities by the Internet search engine Yahoo!
- TSU was recently chosen by the U.S. Department of Energy as the site of a new research center to produce stable, non-radioactive isotopes.
- Tennessee State University is home to two centers of excellence: the Center of Excellence for Research and Policy on Basic Skills and the Center of Excellence for Information Systems Engineering and Management, as well as the Samuel P. Massie Chair of Environmental Engineering, funded by the U.S. Department of Energy.
- Tennessee State University has been listed for the past seven years among the national universities in the *U.S. News & World Report* "Guide to America's Best Colleges."

- The university offers 43 bachelor's degrees and 26 master's degrees, and awards doctoral degrees in six areas: biological sciences, computer information systems engineering, psychology, public administration, curriculum and instruction, and administration and supervision.
- Funding for research at Tennessee State University surpassed \$100 million during the 1990s. TSU has experienced an explosion in sponsored research in recent years, as the University has secured funds to establish a Center for Neural Engineering, a Center for Automated Space Science and a myriad of other programs.





