Origin of Awarding Degrees

The first academic degree was conferred in approximately 1160 A.D. at the University of Bologna, Italy with the practice spreading quickly to other European universities, most notably the University of Paris, Oxford University, and Cambridge University. The procedure we use for awarding degrees at most American universities is based on a practice developed at the University of Paris in the late 12th or early 13th century. In those days the Bishop of Paris, like every other bishop, was responsible for local educational curriculum and degree setting. His authority, however, soon came to be disputed by the teachers. They asserted that only they could be proper judges of qualifications of their students. The threatened impasse was resolved by a compromise, under which the teachers, or masters, judged the merits of the students and then recommended them to the Bishop for the conferring of their degrees.

History of Tennessee State University

Tennessee State University is a comprehensive urban coeducational land-grant university founded in 1912 in Nashville, Tenn. The 450-acre main campus, with more than 65 buildings, is located in a residential setting; the Avon Williams Campus is located downtown, near the center of the Nashville business and government district.

Through successive stages, TSU has developed from a normal school for Negroes to its current status as a national university with students from 45 states and more than 50 countries.

By virtue of a 1909 Act of the General Assembly, the Agricultural and Industrial State Normal School was created, along with two other normal schools in the State of Tennessee, and began serving students on June 19, 1912. William Jasper Hale was appointed as head of the school. The original 247 students, along with the faculty and staff, operated as a family. Everyone worked to keep the institution running in its early years, from clearing rocks to harvesting crops to carrying chairs from class to class. In 1922, the institution was raised to the status of four-year teachers' college and was empowered to grant the bachelor's degree. The first degrees were granted in June 1924. During the same year, the institution became known as the

Agricultural and Industrial State Normal College. In 1927, "Normal" was dropped from the name of the College.

As the college grew in scope and stature throughout the 1920s and 1930s, so too did its impressive roster of alumni who embodied the school's charge: "Enter to learn, go forth to serve." In 1943, when William Hale retired after more than 30 years at the school's helm, an alumnus was chosen to succeed him. From 1943 until his retirement in 1968, Walter S. Davis led the institution through an era of tremendous growth, in areas as multifaceted as academics, facilities and worldwide recognition. The General Assembly of 1941 authorized the State Board of Education to upgrade substantially the educational program of the College, which included the establishment of graduate studies leading to the master's degree. Graduate curricula were first offered in several branches of teacher education. The first master's degree was awarded by the College in June 1944.

Accreditation of the institution by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools was first obtained in 1946. In August 1951, the institution was granted university status by approval of the State Board of Education. The reorganization of the institution's educational program included the establishment of the Graduate School, the School of Arts & Sciences, the School of Education and the School of Engineering. Provisions were also made for the later addition of other schools in agriculture, business and home economics.

On July 1, 1979, the former University of Tennessee at Nashville was merged with TSU as a result of a court order in the 1968 Geier v. Tennessee case.

In 1988, the university received an unprecedented \$112 million from the state general assembly for capital improvements. Under this plan, nearly all buildings on campus have been renovated, and eight new buildings have been constructed, including the Floyd-Payne Campus Center, the Ned McWherter Administration Building, the Wilma Rudolph Residence Center and the Performing Arts Center. Currently, the downtown campus is undergoing an \$18.5 million renovation project. Through its eight colleges and schools, the TSU of today offers 43 bachelor's degrees and 26 master's degrees, and awards doctoral degrees in six areas: biological sciences, computer information systems engineering, psychology, public administration, curriculum and instruction, and administration and supervision.

Our Speaker



Dr. Richard G. Rhoda has dedicated his entire career to higher education in Tennessee. He joined the staff of the Tennessee Board of Regents as a graduate student in 1973. Over the next 12 years he assumed a progression of staff capacities, eventually becoming the executive assistant to the chancellor from 1980 to 1985. These were the formative years of the TBR system, which had been established in 1972. Dr. Rhoda contributed significantly to the development of initial system-wide policies and information systems. He served as the Regents' chief public information officer. It was during this period that he participated in chronicling the early history of Tennessee's community colleges, and pursued his academic research interests in higher education and public policy issues.

In 1985, Dr. Rhoda joined the administration of Tennessee State University, the State's 1890 Land-Grant institution. This was a period of significant change at TSU; a settlement had been reached in the statewide higher education desegregation lawsuit, with TSU as the centerpiece. Dr. Rhoda fulfilled a series of assignments at TSU, which included leading external relations, heading the university's downtown campus, launching the Institute of Government and recruiting the charter class of Ph.D. students, and serving as chief development officer.

Dr. Rhoda returned to the TBR staff in 1990 as vice chancellor for administration. While serving in this capacity he assumed a series of interim appointments. He was called upon to serve as the interim president of Nashville State Technical Institute during the 1991-92 academic year, where he was responsible for correcting severe fiscal and personnel issues at the institution. In 1993, upon the untimely death of the sitting Regents chancellor, Otis L. Floyd, Jr., Dr. Rhoda was named acting chancellor. In that assignment he carried out many of Dr. Floyd's initiatives and staffed the search for a permanent chancellor. In 1994, he served briefly as interim president of Austin Peay State University while fulfilling his role as vice chancellor.

Dr. Rhoda left public higher education in 1995 to join the faculty of Vanderbilt University. He was the original assistant director of the Peabody Center for Education Policy, which was created that year to be a national policy research center. He contributed to the Center's charter research agenda, a significant part of which came to fruition with the establishment of the Consortium on Renewing Education. He also taught undergraduate and graduate courses.

In early 1997, Dr. Rhoda returned to the Tennessee Board of Regents as senior vice chancellor for academic affairs and strategic planning. Later that year, however, he was called upon to head the Tennessee Higher Education Commission (THEC). His immediate objectives as executive director were to resume the statutory work of the Commission, restore relationships with the General Assembly and State Administration, and improve accountability of the Commission within the higher education community. The Commission now is recognized for its leadership in public policy and higher education policy analyses.

As executive director of THEC, Dr. Rhoda is a member of the University of Tennessee Board of Trustees, the Tennessee Board of Regents, the State (Tennessee) Board of Education, the Tennessee Student Assistance Corporation Board of Directors, the Board of Trustees of the Baccalaureate Education System Trust, and the Tennessee Foreign Language Institute Board of Directors.

He actively represents Tennessee in: the State Higher Education Executive Officers organization; the Education Commission of the States, serving on the steering committee; the Southern Regional Education Board; and The College Board, serving on the southern Regional Council. He is a member of the American Association of University Professors.

Dr. Rhoda was born in Allentown, Pennsylvania on June 14, 1950. He was educated in the public schools of Westfield, New Jersey and Suffern, New York. He earned the Bachelor of Arts in History from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee (1972), the Master of Arts in Education from George Peabody College for Teachers in Nashville (1974), and the Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration from Vanderbilt University (1985).

He is married to Nancy Chickering Rhoda, who recently retired as a career photojournalist with 'The Tennessean' newspaper. They have a daughter, Meredith, born in 1984, and a son, Nicholas, born in 1986.

The Symbols of Office

The University Seal

In 1922, President William Jasper Hale, first president of Tennessee A. and I. Normal School, asked Frances Thompson, Professor and Department Head of Art, to design the University Seal. Enclosed in a circle, the seal is divided into three parts: Agriculture upper left, Industry upper right, Education in lower center. Education is further emphasized by a hand holding a light with rays extending above the seal. The motto, Think—Work—Serve, is placed beneath the seal for support.



Presidential Medallion and Chain of Office



The Presidential Medallion and Chain of Office serve as a symbol of authority as head of the university. It originated in medieval times and is worn by the President of the University on ceremonial occasions such as commencement, convocations, or other formal occasions.

The Medallion and Chain of Office, the first in the history of the University, was commissioned in 2005 by Dr. Melvin N. Johnson, the seventh president of the University. The front of the medallion bears the official University Seal.

The backside of the medallion was conceptualized by Dr. Johnson and artistically designed by Professor Carlyle Johnson, Department Head of Art. The seal is circular with a blue border bearing the President's motto in Latin: NIL SINE MAGNO LABORE – "Nothing without Great Effort." Encircling the inside base of the seal on a background of silver is President Johnson's trademark, which is a suspended bridge supported by three massive pillars with extended pinnacles symbolizing the institution's Past, Present, and Future. At the top center is the year that the institution was founded and at the bottom is the year that the Medallion and Chain of Office was conceived.

Each link of the chain holding the medallion is inscribed with the name of a past president of the institution and his term in office. Holding together these links and supporting the medallion is a bronze leaf cluster.

University Mace and Baton

In 2005, the mace and baton was conceptualized by Dr. Melvin N. Johnson and artistically designed by Professor Carlyle Johnson, Department Head of Art, with layout and logistical formatting provided by Dr. John Cade, Dean of Admissions and Records.

The Lapis stone characterizes the TSU Blue and is used to stimulate inner vision and give enhanced wisdom, insight, and good judgment. The pearl stone represents the TSU White and symbolizes the wealth, purity, and power of knowledge. The head and flanges of the mace are modeled after the Floyd-Payne Campus Center Tower located on the University's main campus. The reflective quality of the polished silver signifies the vision of the University.



The baton of the mace is made of wood which is a forest symbol or the symbol of a provider. It represents a tree of knowledge around which each of the mace serves to link the University ancestral past.

The History of Academic Regalia

The history of academic dress began with the medieval European universities of the 14th century. In a time when all students were clerics, the gown and its attached hood served the dual function of keeping the student warm in unheated buildings and identifying the particular order to which he belonged.

Modern academic costume in the United States is based upon an intercollegiate code established in 1895. These early agreements have been revised periodically to cover standardization of the cap (two basic styles), the gown (three basic styles), and the hood (subject to greater variation than either the cap or the gown). The cap, originally round in shape, is usually the more familiar mortarboard square with tassel or black Oxford style.

The gown, commonly black, differs in sleeves and trimming according to the level of degree. The bachelor's gown is relatively simple in design. It is full-cut, falling in a straight line from an elaborate yoke, with long pointed sleeves as its distinguishing mark. The master's gown is similar to the bachelor's except for its peculiar arrangement of the oblong sleeves which terminate in square ends at the wearer's knees; the wearer's arms emerge through slits in the sleeves made at the elbows. Short-sleeved master's gowns are also worn. The doctoral gown is an elaborate, full-cut, flowing costume distinguished by velvet panels down the front and round the neck and by three bars of velvet on the voluminous bell-shaped sleeves. The velvet is usually black, but it may be a color designating the field of study (for example, dark blue for philosophy).

The hood, traditionally bearing the heaviest symbolic burden, is the most important feature of the academic costume. The length of the hood and the width of its velvet trimming designate the level of the degree. The hood's lining identifies the institution that granted the degree, and the color of the velvet heralds the major field of learning.

Tennessee State University has a Pilot Center for Academic Excellence in Intelligence Studies, one of only four in the nation, which prepares students for professional careers in the U.S. intelligence community.

Tennessee State University is the only HBCU in the nation to have a Supply Chain Management program--the study of e-business and global manufacturing--at both the graduate and undergraduate levels.

Tennessee State University's engineering students are developing robots the U.S. Army can use to sweep for mines, and a software program they developed for Boeing is saving space in airplane cockpits and other workspaces.

Tennessee State University has a technology-based partnership with IBM. Since 2000, IBM has hired 69 of our students a permanent hires, interns, or cooperative education students. The average starting salary for permanent hires has been \$61,000. These students are trained in cutting-edge technologies, such as e-business technologies, which are readily available to them at the university.

Tennessee State University has the No. 1 forensics team among black colleges in the nation and is ranked 22 among all universities and third among universities of its size.

In recent years, Tennessee State University's athletes have had the highest graduation rate in the Tennessee Board of Regents system and among historically black colleges and universities.

The Olympian statue located at Olympic Plaza, the entrance to the Gentry Center Athletic Complex honors Tennessee State University's 59 Olympic athletes, who won 32 medals, 17 of them gold.

Tennessee State University offers 42 graduate degrees and 25 undergraduate degrees. Tennessee State University is known for producing outstanding engineers, nurses, and teachers.

Tennessee State University is one of only three historically black colleges in the nation with a Phi Kappa Phi honor society, the most prestigious honor society comprising all academic disciplines.
