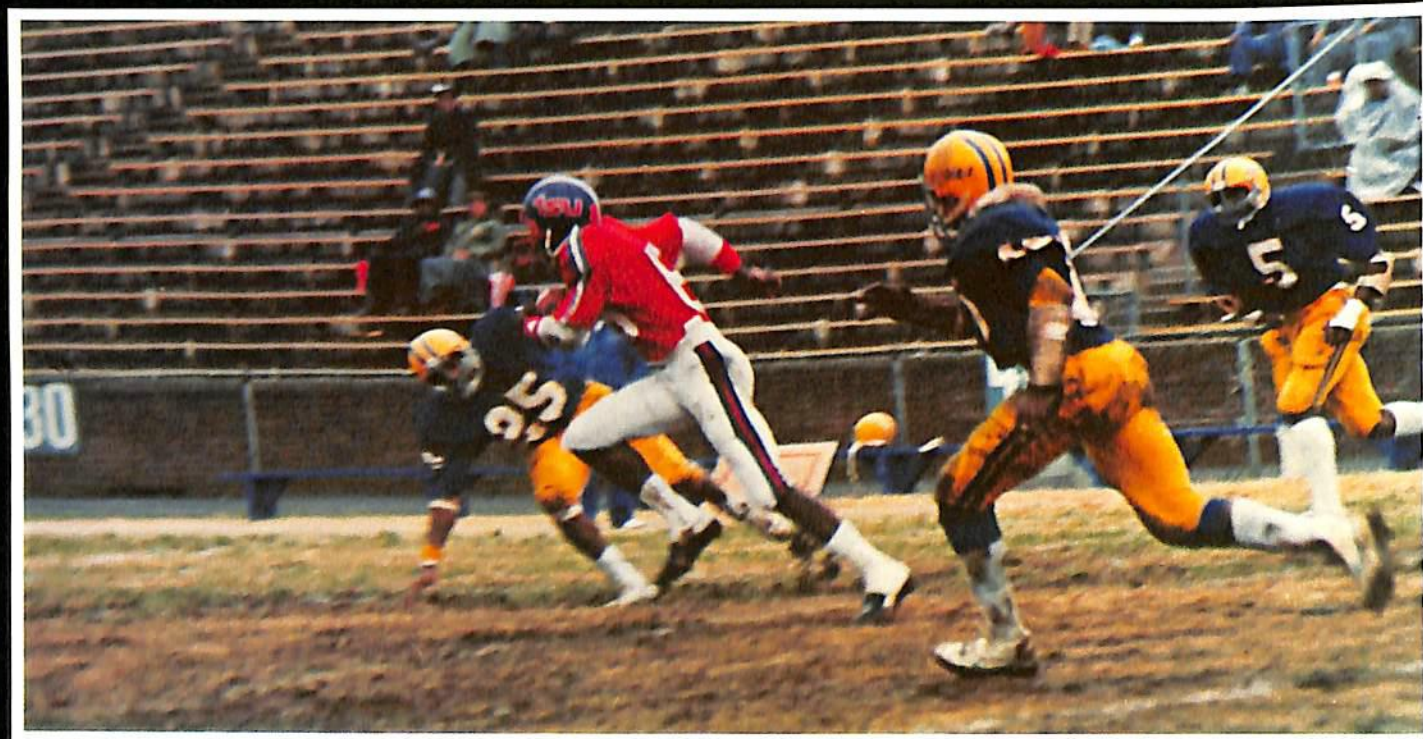
Dr. Barbara Nye, executive director of the Tennessee Head Start Training Facility, was recognized for her contributions to the community by the National Continuing Education Association.

It was an extraordinary year in athletics at TSU. The Football Team went to the NCAA Division 1-AA playoffs; the Men's and Women's Basketball Teams provided excitement for fans; the Baseball Team had an exceptional year, as did the Men's Track and Swim Teams; and the Tigerbelles maintained their high level of performance as they prepared for the 1984 Olympics.

Mike Jones, number 89, set a new NCAA career record with 40 touchdown catches. Herman Hunter, number 36, set NCAA all-time single game records — one for kick-off returns (262 yards), and one for all-purpose running (464 yards).

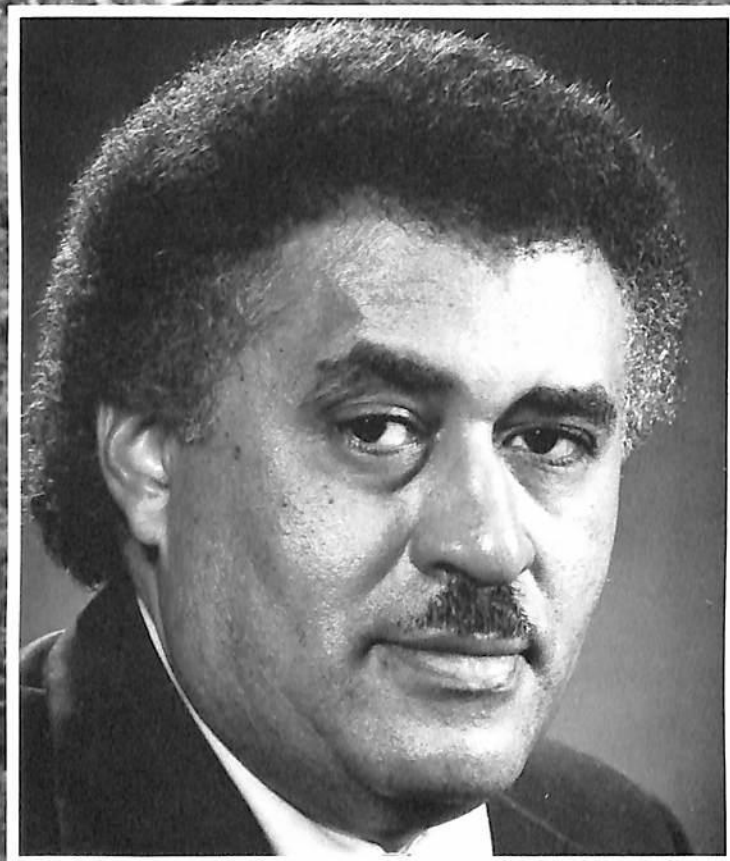
Our final report for the year shows that the University has achieved significant growth in its program as well as broad participation by its individual members and groups.

We have expanded the involvement of our academic schools in the delivery of non-credit offerings and increased the number of participants in our on-campus and off-campus classes. 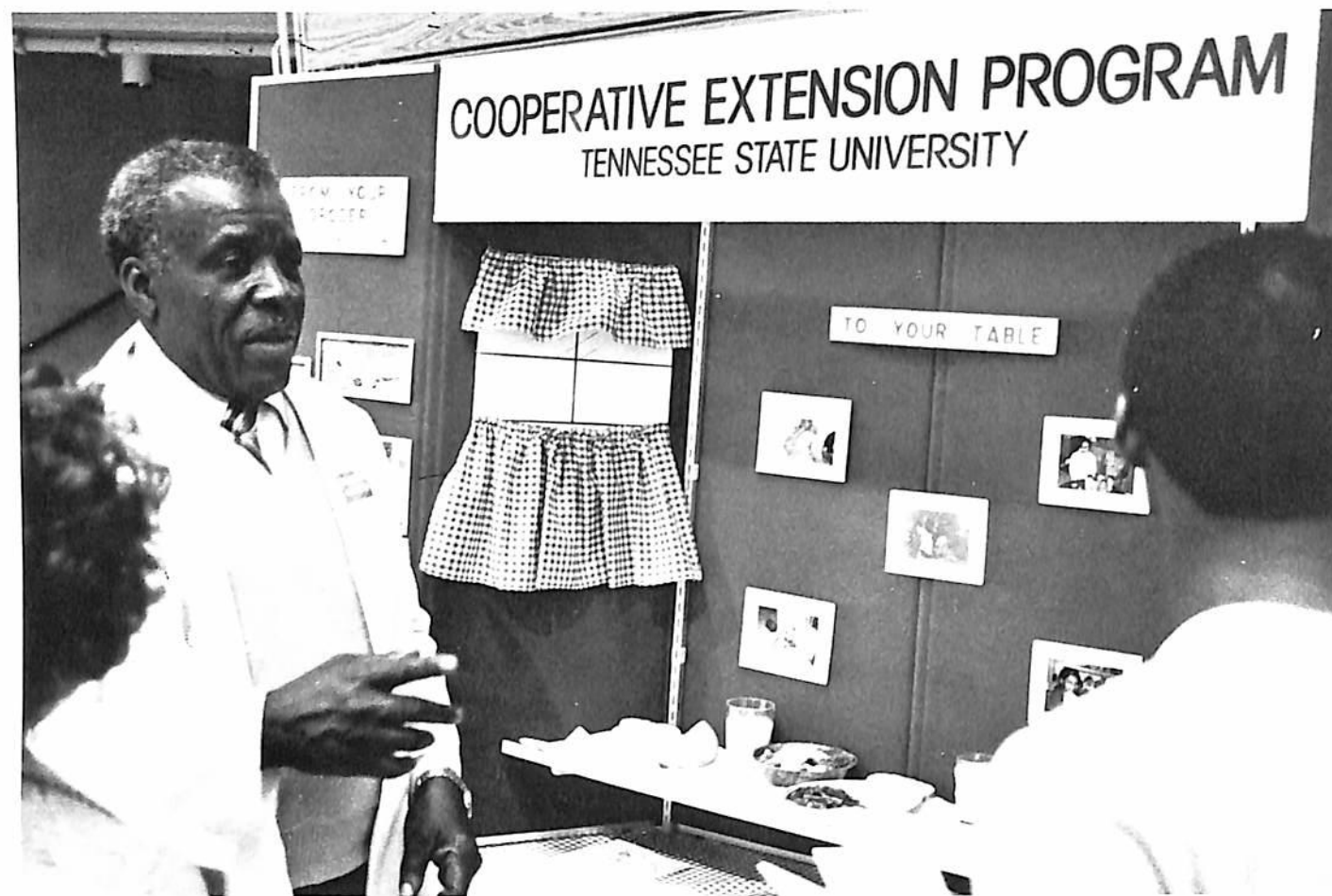
"Ballad of the Secretary's Dilemma"

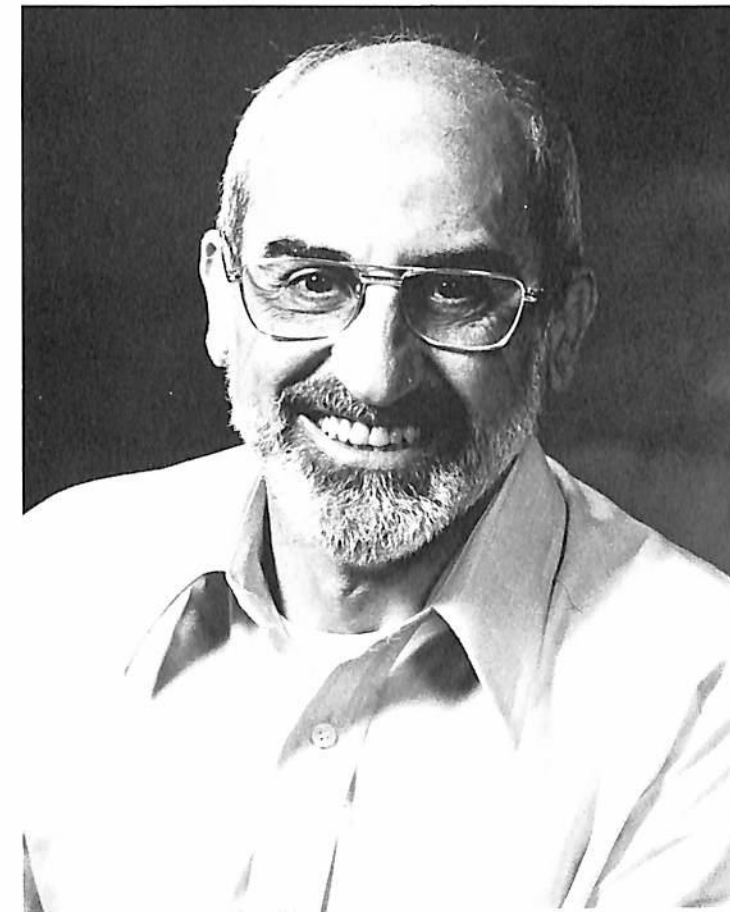

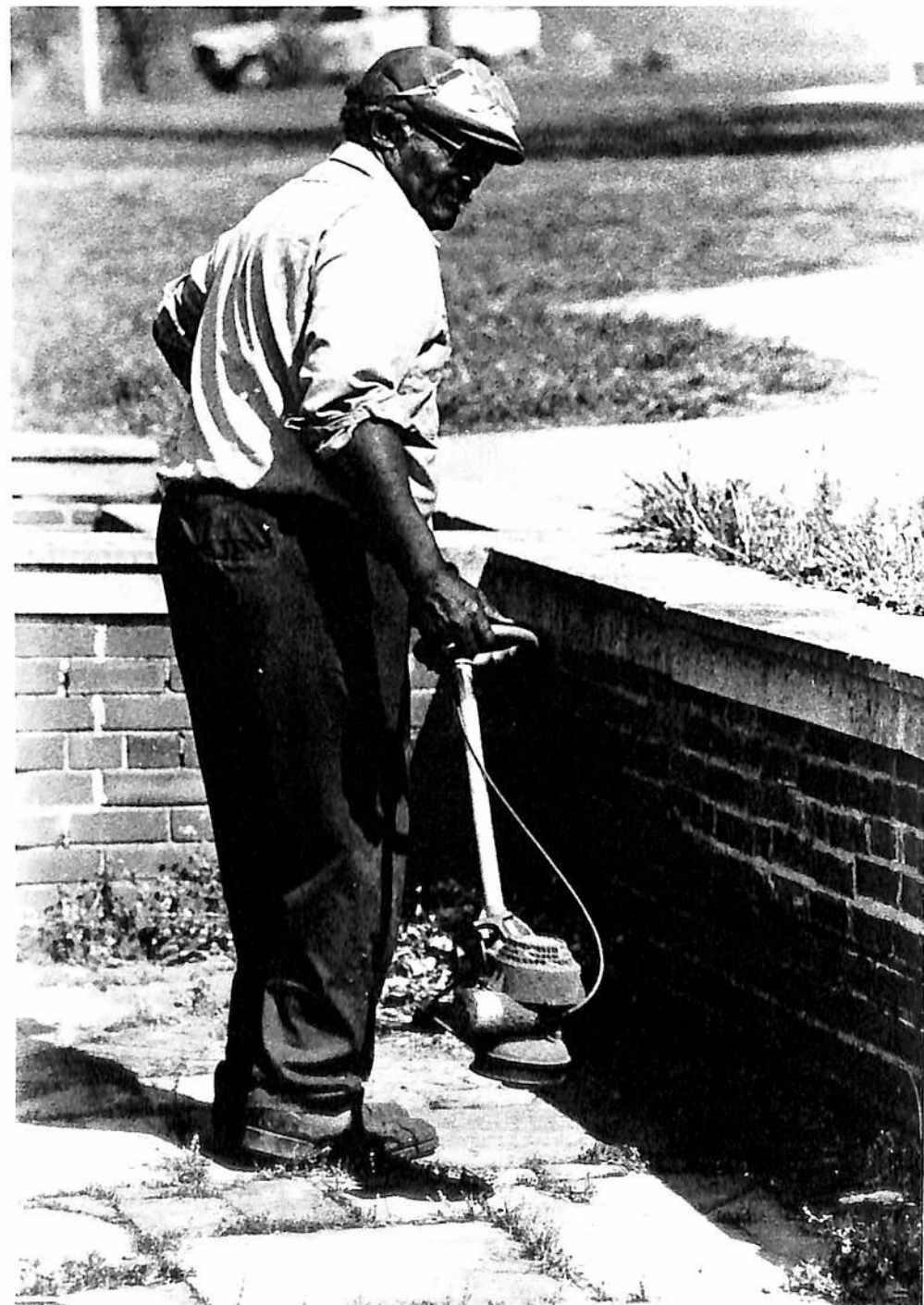

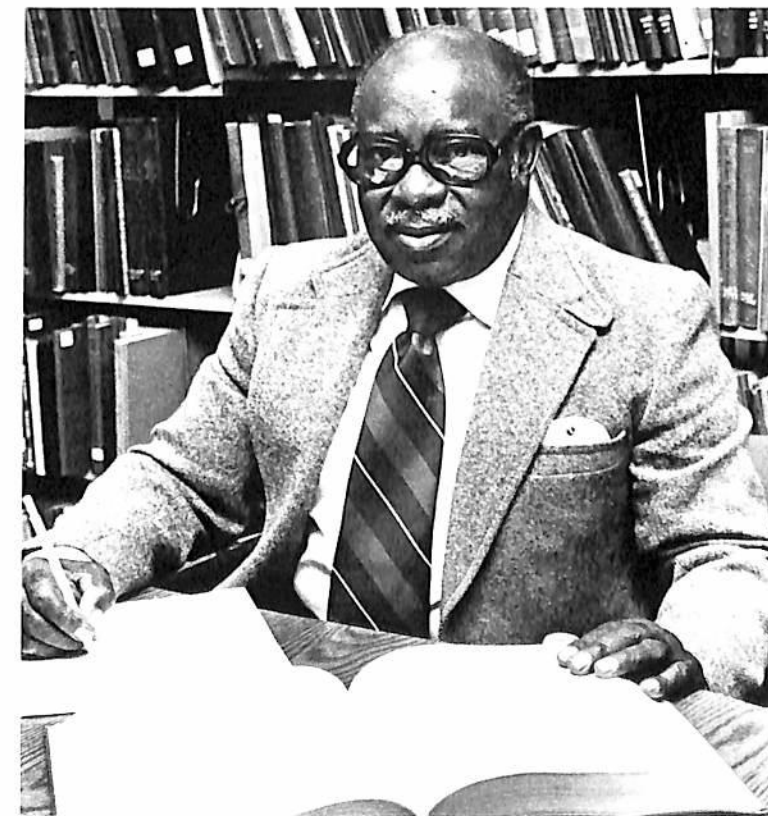

Mrs. Mozenia J. Stinson, a 1949 business administration graduate of TSU, retired from 32 years of continuous service in January 1983. Over the years she held a variety of positions, including secretary to the dean of admissions, assistant to the dean of admissions and records, assistant director of admissions and records, coordinator of admissions and records, associate director of institutional self-study, secretary of institutional research and development, and administrative assistant and executive aid to the vice president for research and development.

"I've met a lot of beautiful people," she said. "I will miss the place," she added as she explained a good deal of her time will be spent raising roses now that she has retired.



Cecille Crump

The same reason that brought Dr. Cecille Crump to Tennessee State University in 1944 caused her to put off retiring from the School of Business faculty in the fall of 1981. It was "a concern for the welfare" of her students.

Dr. Crump, who holds the distinction of serving as acting dean of the School of Business when it was formed in July 1977 — first woman to reach that high administrative rank on this campus — officially retired January 10. She left in the position of associate dean of the School of Business.

Her thoughts on leaving TSU? "My belief is that things come to pass. I gladly pass on my leadership role to let someone else have a chance to experience leadership opportunities and to help others as they come along," she answered.



Camille Robinson

Camille Robinson, who retired at the end of the spring semester, closed out 35 years of service to the University. The 1944 TSU graduates' contributions as a member of the staff and faculty were recognized this year when she was declared a Founder's Day honoree. Beginning her career as a secretary in the Department of Home Economics, Ms. Robinson began her move to the business school faculty by teaching several business education courses, including executive secretary skills, office machines, shorthand, and typewriting. About eight years ago she served as assistant director of the business education evening school.

Future plans include returning to Chattanooga, Tenn., her hometown, and travel to Europe and Africa.



Gretchen Payne

Dr. Gretchen B. Payne, professor of education and chairperson of the department of curriculum and instruction, set June 30 as her retirement date from Tennessee State University.

For 25 years, Dr. Payne has given dedicated service to TSU in the School of Education. She has served in several capacities including director of curriculum laboratory, acting director of student teaching, director of career opportunities program and the Teacher Education Alliance for Metro Project.

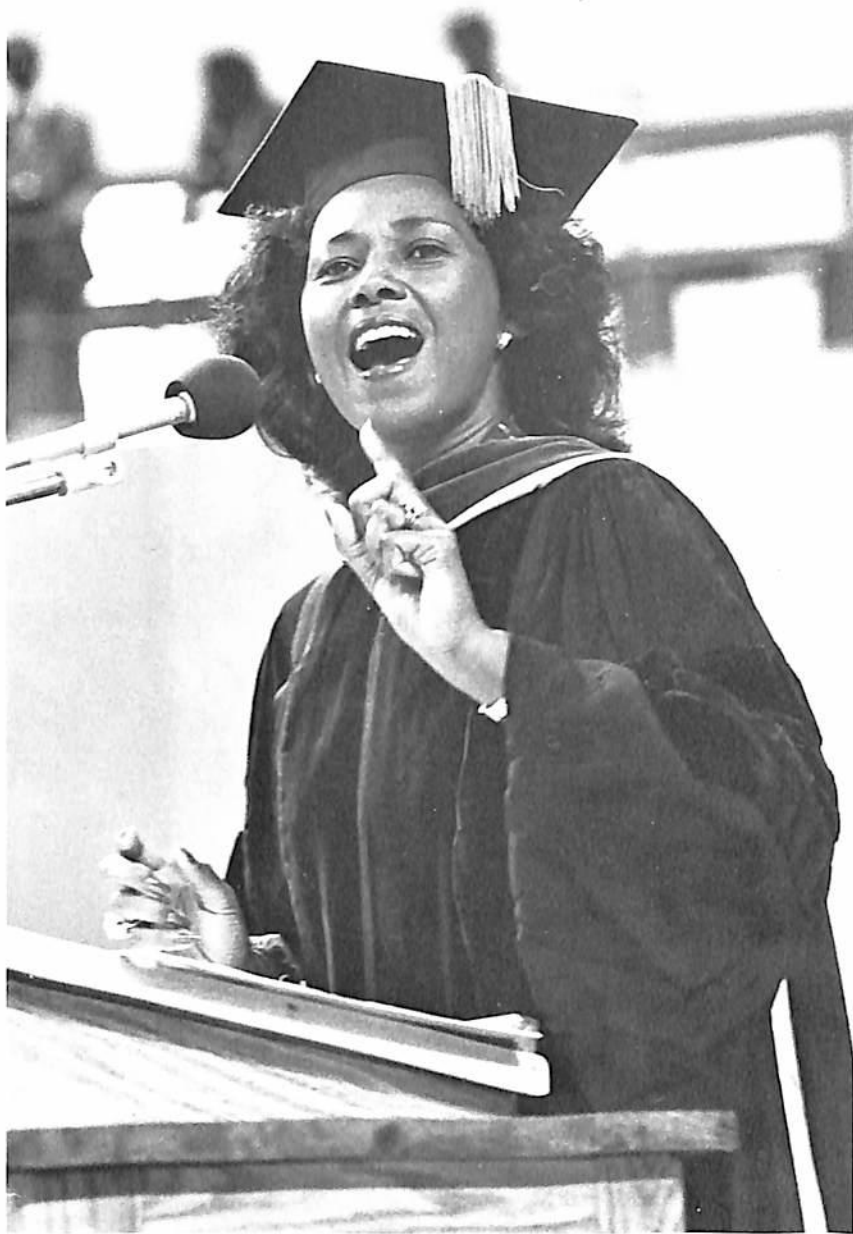

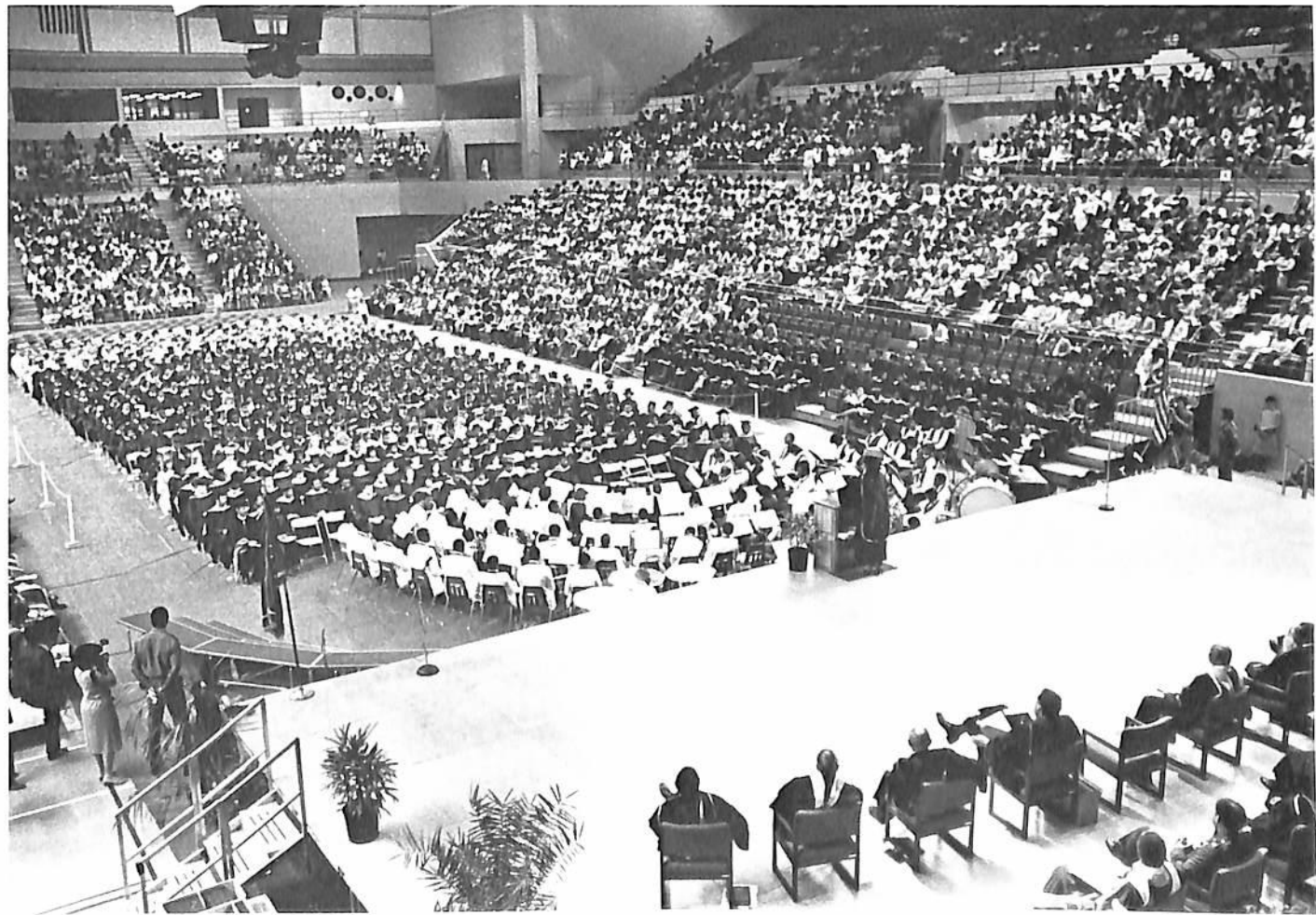

TSU LIBRARIES AND LEARNING RESOURCES

In keeping with the underlying philosophy of the University to provide the best possible facilities for the growth and development of students and faculty, the libraries and media centers recognize that they have a major role in connection with the educational and research programs of the University. To this end, the objectives below constitute basic guidelines for its operation.

1. To provide library and media materials equipment, and services for students, faculty, and staff members.
2. To give guidance to scholars at all levels in their search for information.
3. To assist faculty in the area of media in terms of selection, evaluation and the appropriate use of media in facilitating the teaching/learning process.
4. To encourage students to develop a wider interest in learning through reading beyond specific class assignments; and through independent study and the use of media resources.
5. To work with other libraries and media centers in the community, the region and elsewhere through such avenues as interlibrary loan, the Southeastern Library Network (SO-LINET), DIALOG Information Services, the State Board of Regents Media Consortium and other cooperative efforts.
6. To maintain viable multi-media collections through a broad based system of collection development and the use of technology.
7. To provide a physical environment, which will encourage optimum use of the services of the libraries and media centers.
8. To maintain a strong orientation and bibliographic program.

Students are chosen for this honor by the heads of their departments based upon the following criteria.

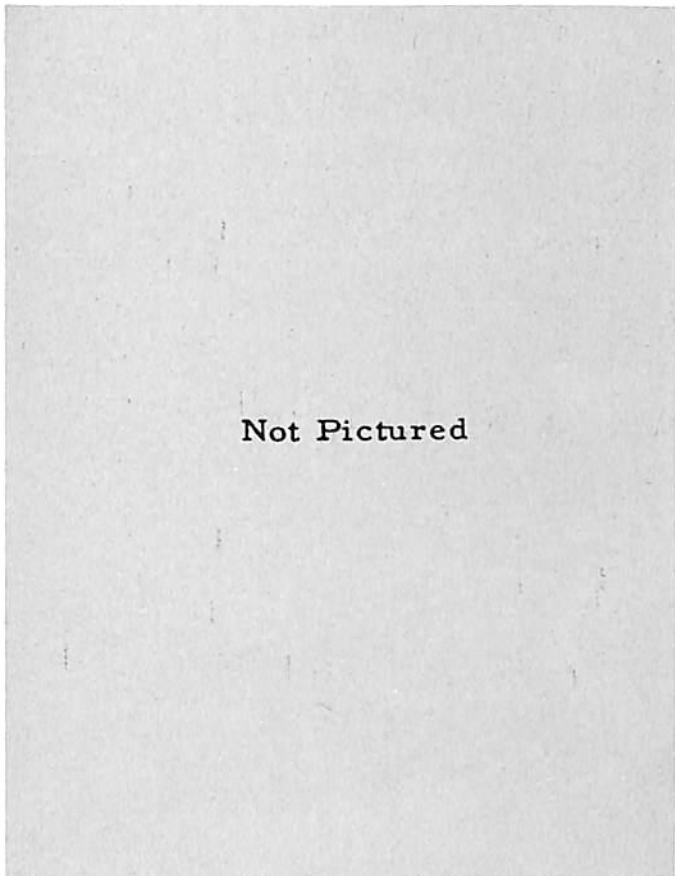
1. Student scholarship

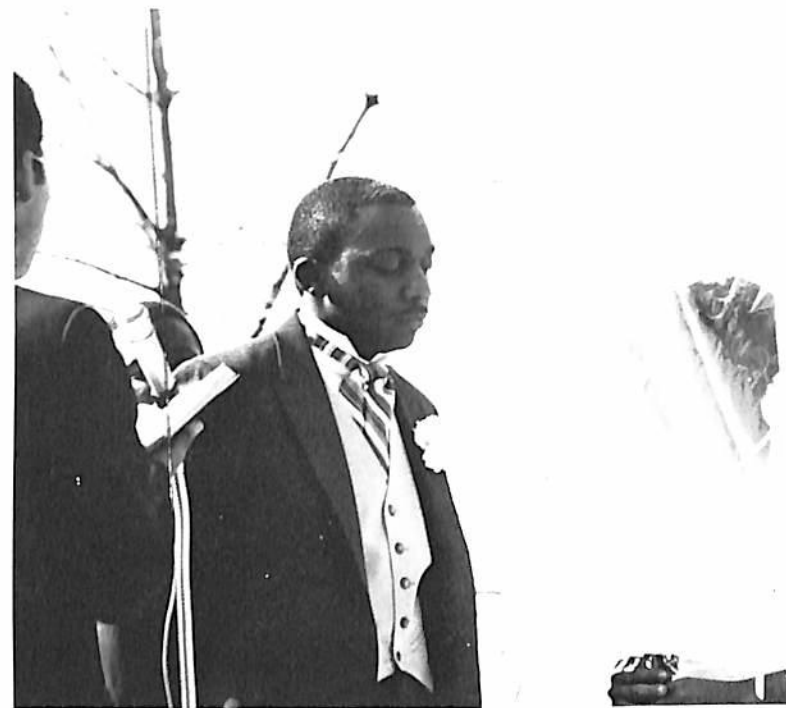
MOCK WEDDING

The mock wedding was held April 15 at 2 p.m. in the University Plaza. Brenda and David were both seniors majoring in Communications and they sang their own wedding song.

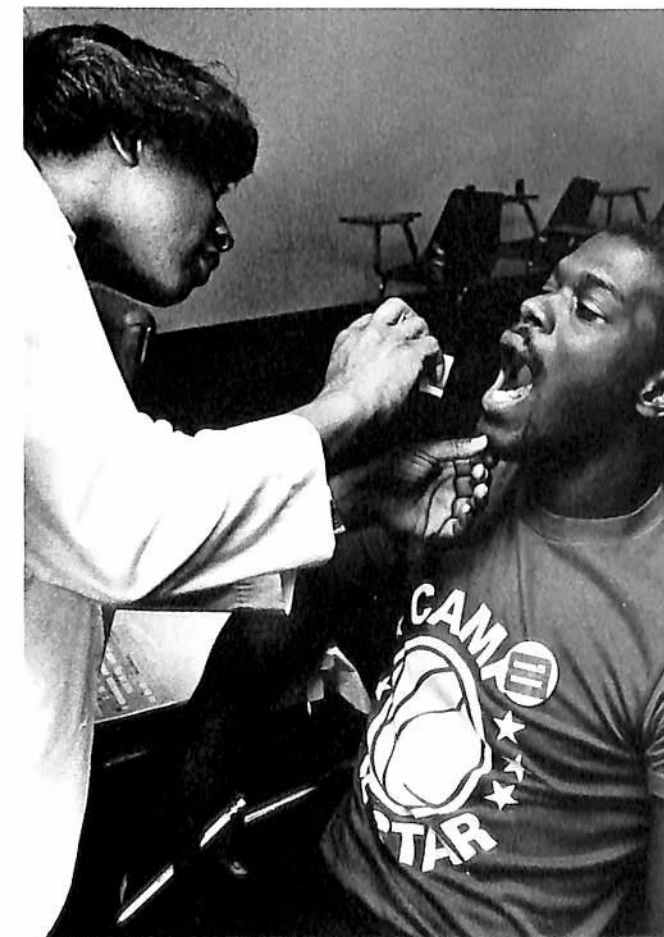

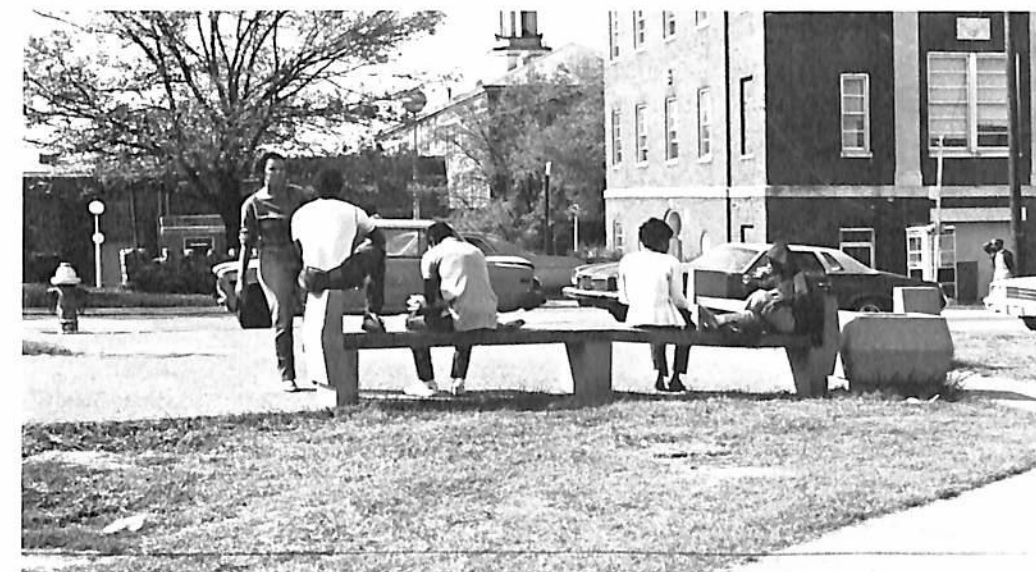
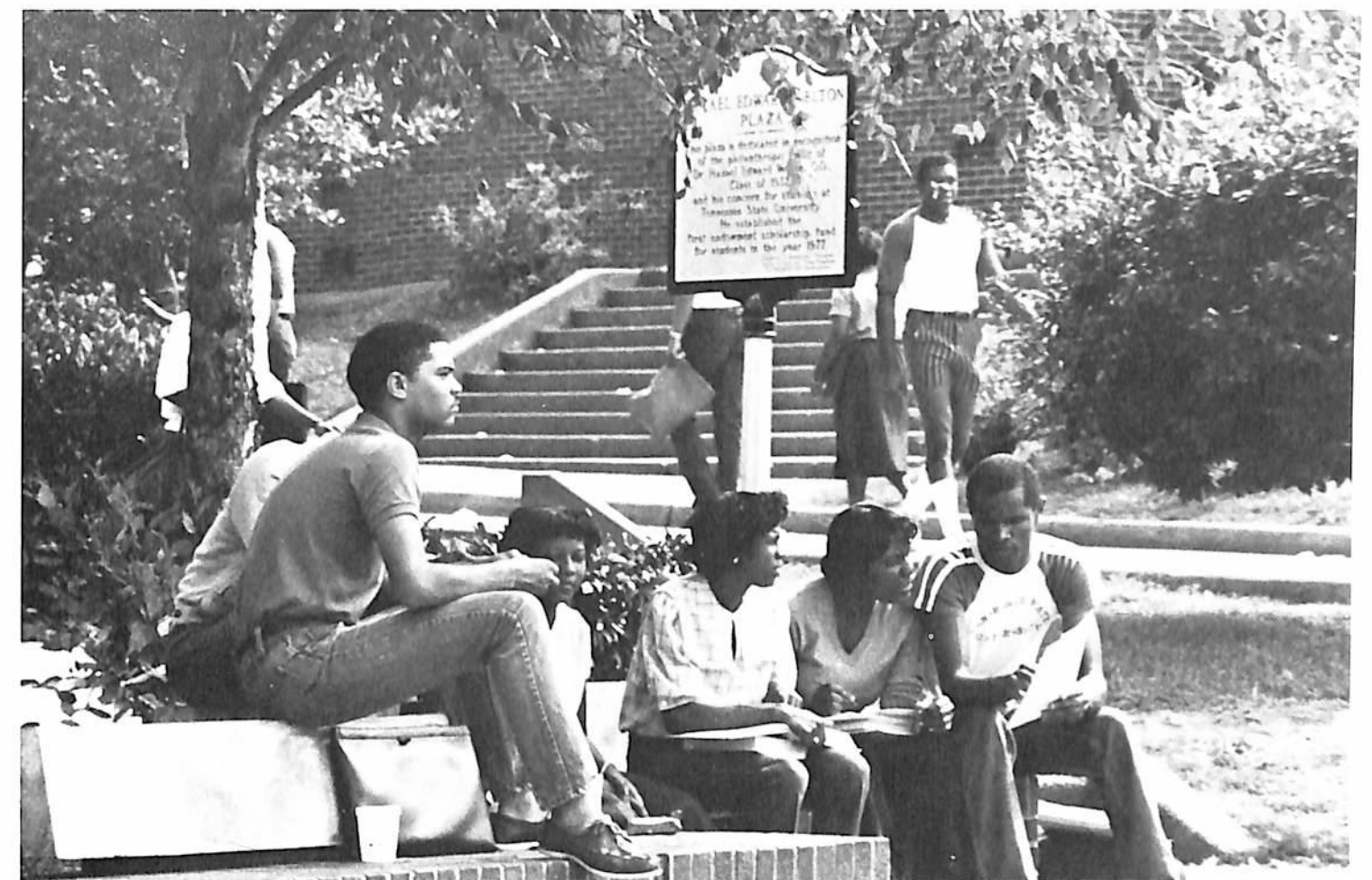
The Tennessee State University Iota Chapter of Alpha Delta Mu National Social Work Honor Society, Inc. was chartered in 1976. The criteria for membership are:

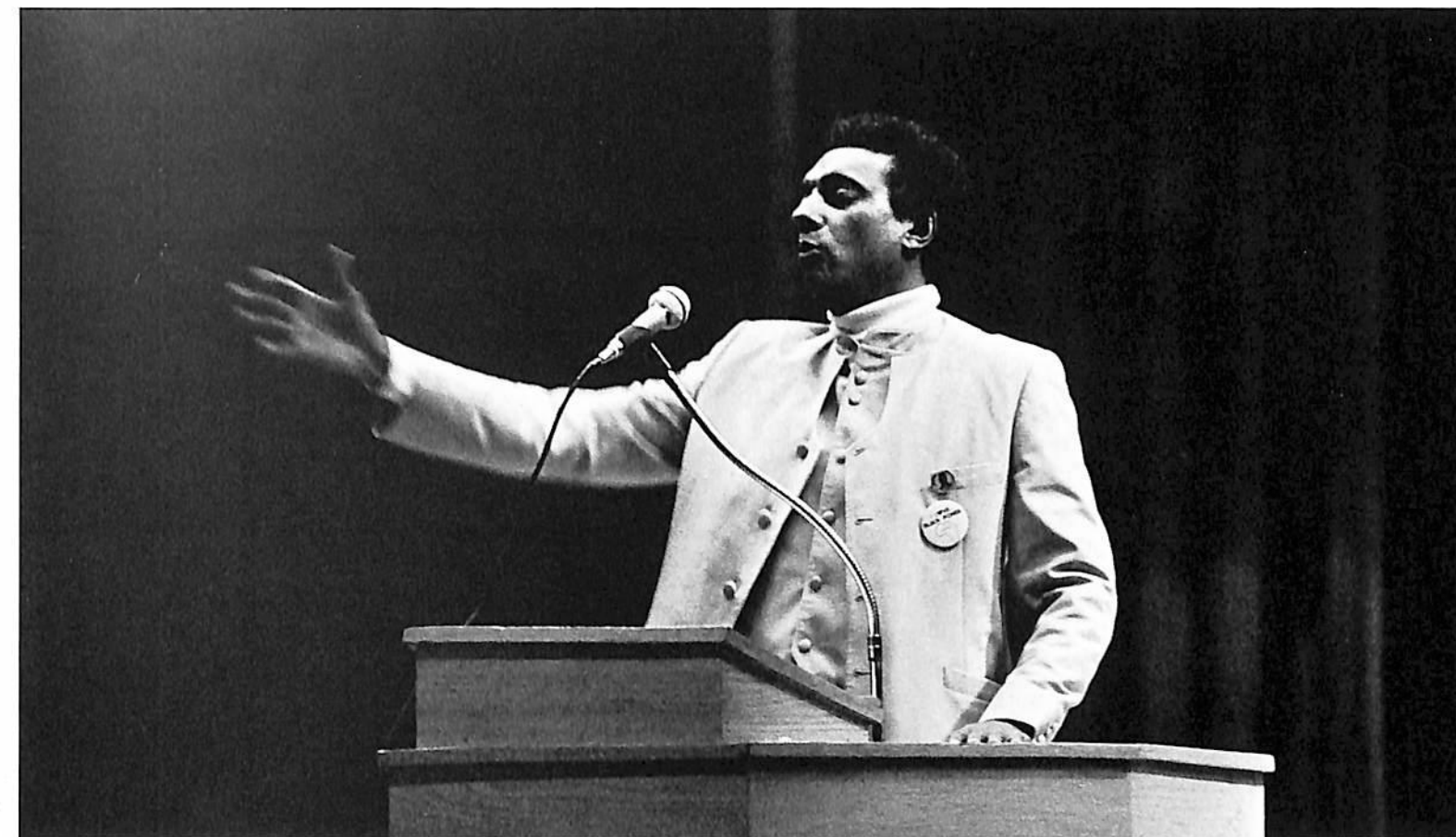

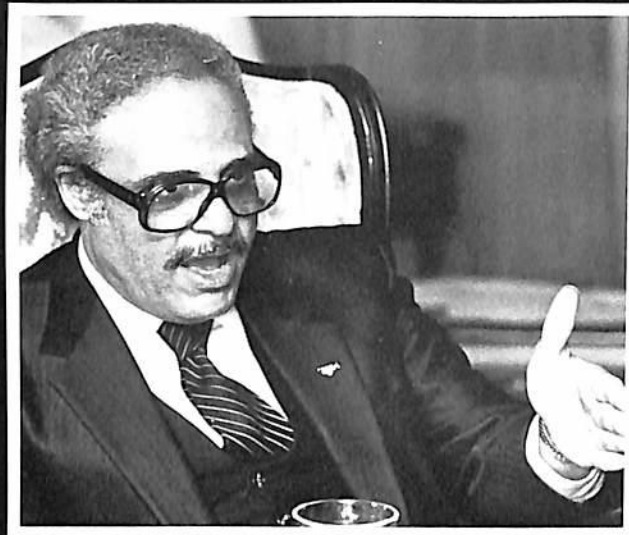

HOOKS URGES BLACKS TO VOTE, TO DREAM.

"Reagan is the sorriest President of the twentieth century," according to Benjamin Hooks, the national executive director of the NAACP.

Speaking at the Gentry Complex at the Co-Curricular awards program, Hooks said, "America has tried to get ahead by feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless, and the best that this administration can do is replace the soup lines with the cheese lines."

Hooks urged the sparse, enthusiastic crowd to vote — "the most powerful, precious and persuasive weapon that blacks have."

Quoting Frederick Douglass, Hook said, "slaves can't vote themselves free, but free men and women can vote themselves slaves by their indifference, lethargy, unconcern and laziness."

"There are those who think their vote does not make a difference," Hooks said. "Those who don't believe this should go to Chicago and ask Jane Byrne who was recently outsted as the Democratic mayoral

candidate by Horold Washington."

The civil rights leader confidently stated that Washington would win the upcoming Chicago mayoral elections but also stated that if he happens not to win, "at least we fixed it so those who had it, won't have it anymore."

Hooks quoted Langston Hughes, "Never lose hold to your dreams, for without dreams life is a broken winged bird that cannot fly." Blacks have always believed that tomorrow would be a better day, Hooks said.

"Despite the unemployment rate of 22%, the unemployment rate of 50% for black youth between the ages of 18-25, and also including the fact that there are about 9 million blacks living at or below the poverty level, we are still holding on to our dreams," Hooks said.

Trying is a very important element in life, according to Hooks. The outspoken leader quoted Benjamin Mayes, the Moorehouse College President, and stated that "tragedy doesn't consist of having tried and

failed, the tragedy consists of never having tried at all." Hooks encouraged the students to continue the long hard successful struggle of their ancestors.

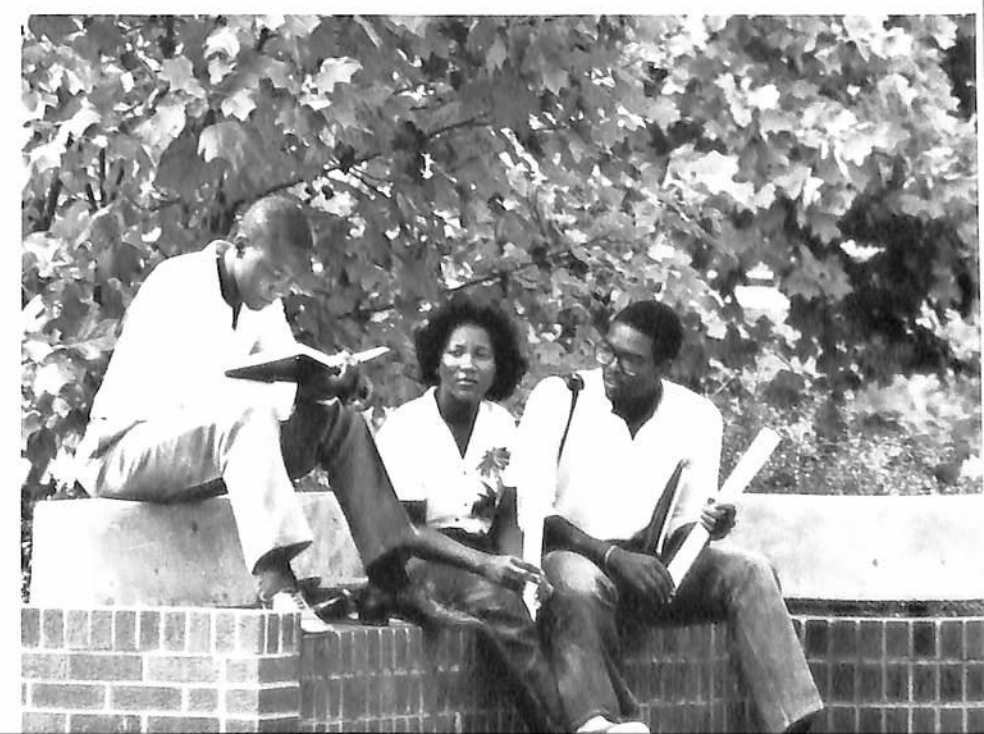
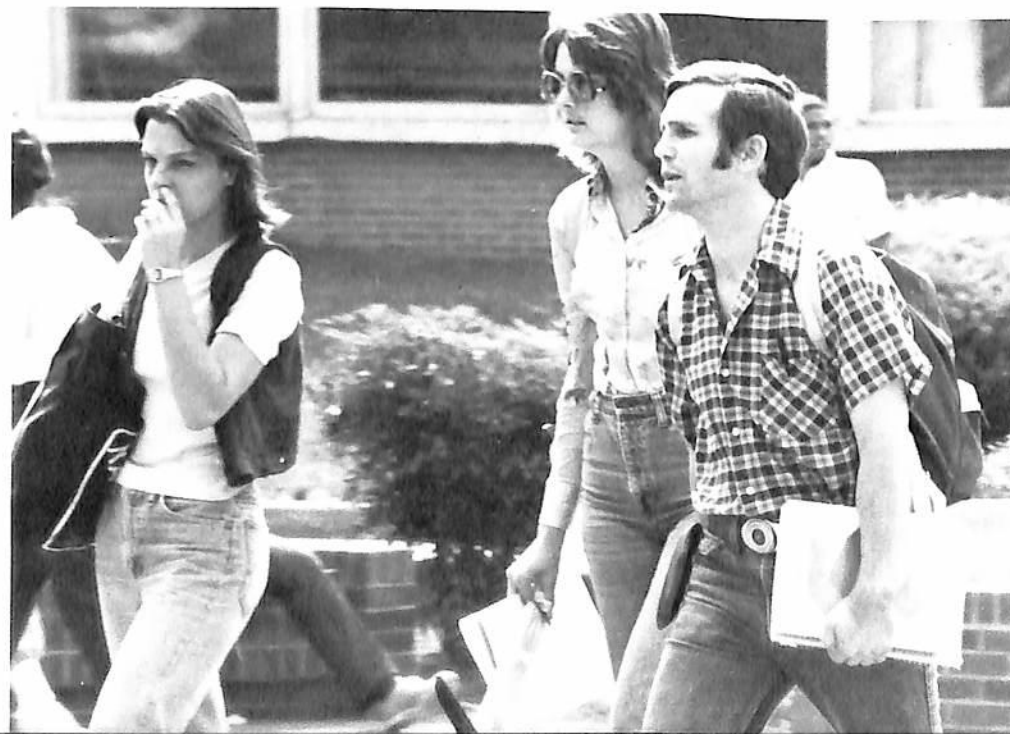
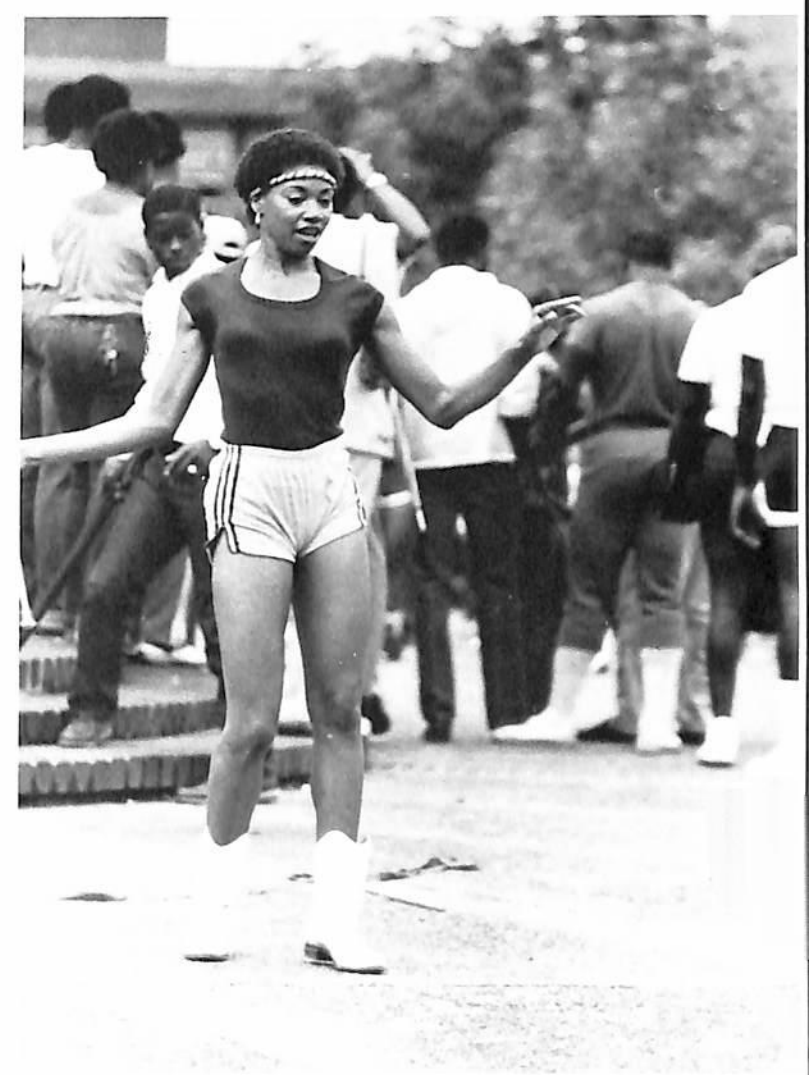
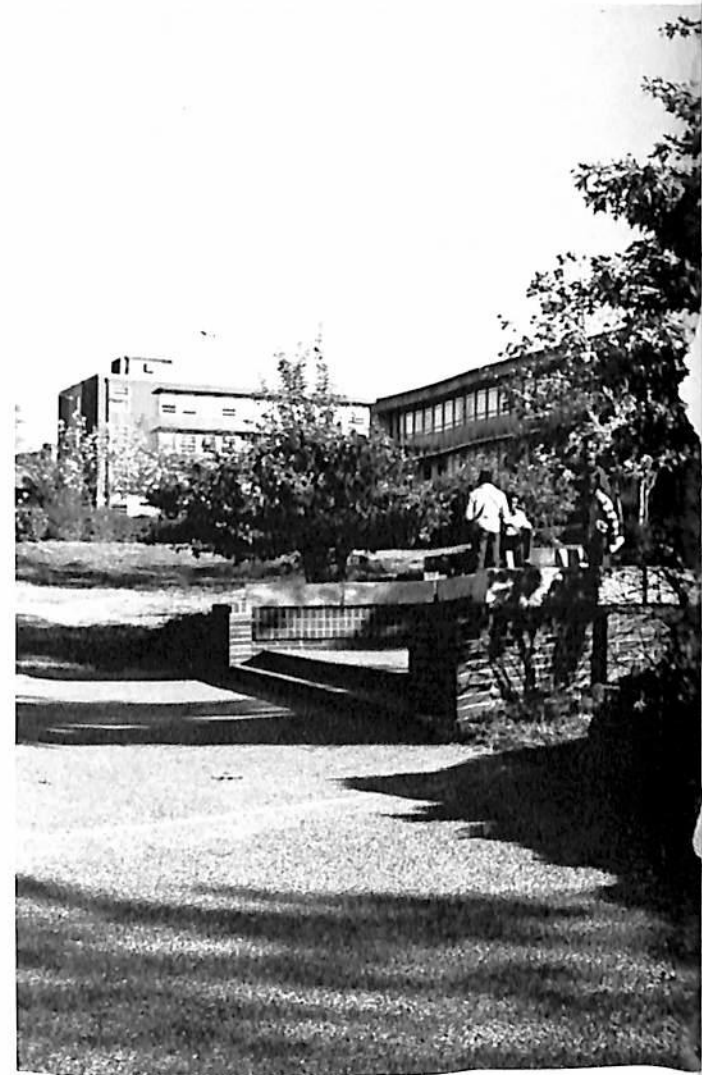
Hooks pushed the students to keep struggling, hit the books and burn the midnight oil. He stressed that college should not only be a place for having a good time, but a place where you educate your mind and body. He also emphasized that students should take school more seriously.

While exerting signs of a true believer, the NAACP leader said, "I feel good about the 1983 generation of today, who won't let anybody turn them around. I sent a letter in a heated exchange with President Reagan reminding him that you may kill the dreamer, but not the dream."

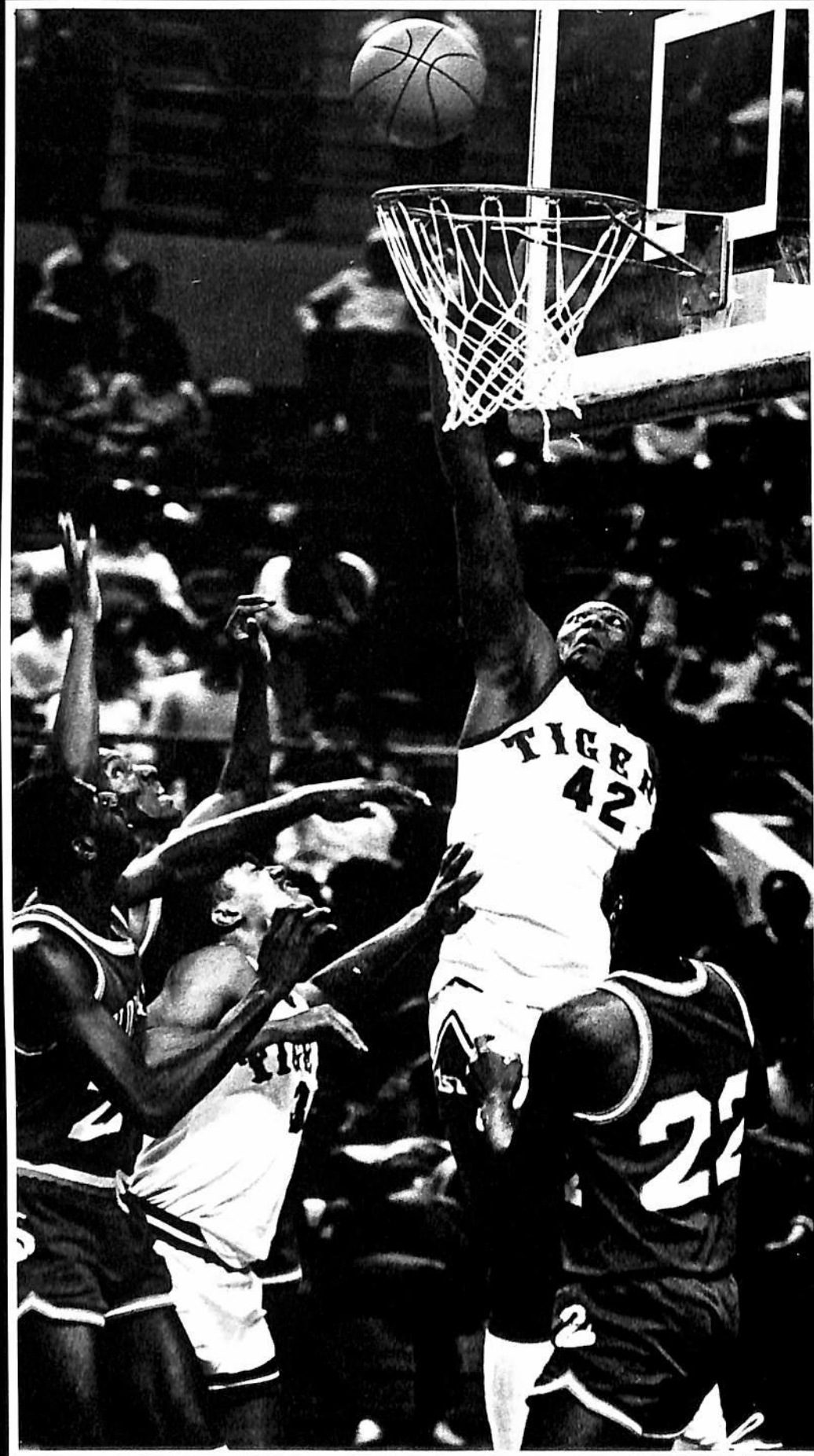


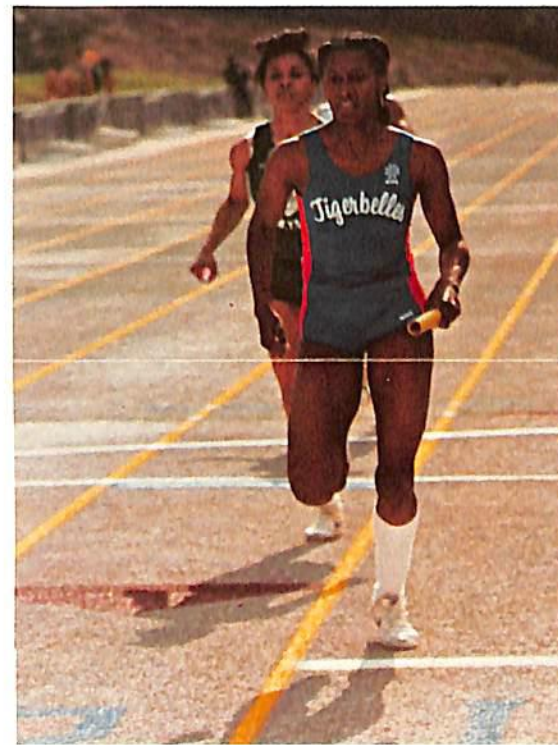

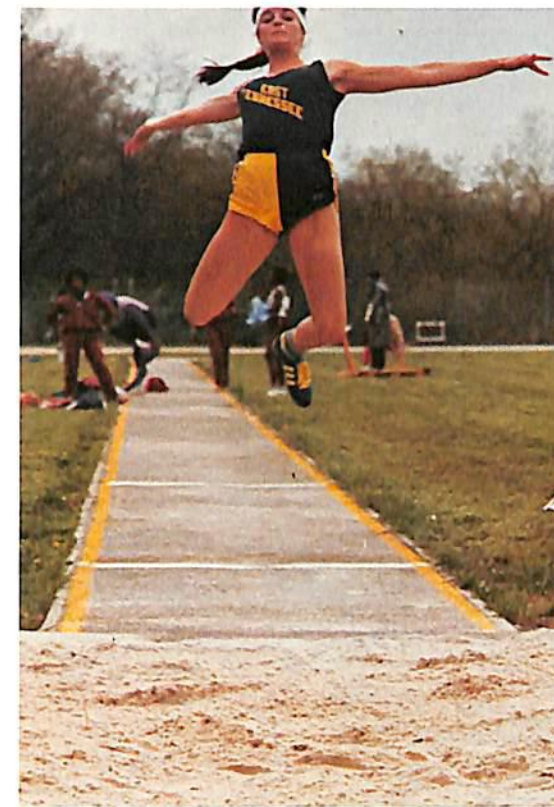

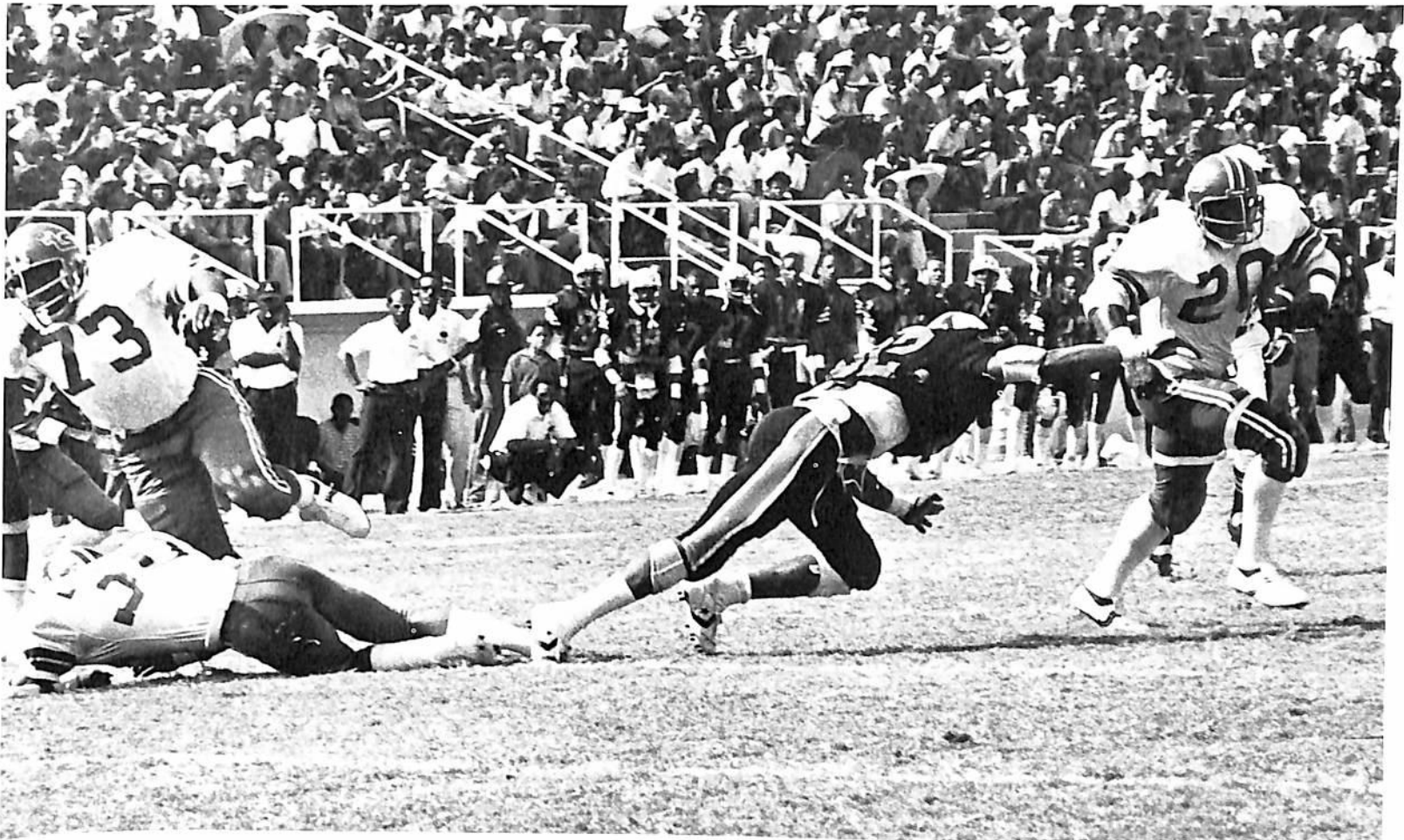
