

France has been asked to leave the West African country of **Burkina Faso** after receiving a similar request from Mali, a bordering country, last year, in August 2022. The French were there to help fight jihadists in both countries. Currently, Burkina Faso and Mali are turning to Russia for support but are not cutting diplomatic ties with France. A day before a U.S. military jet <u>shot down a suspected</u>
<u>Chinese spy balloon</u> off the country's Atlantic Coast on
Saturday, **Colombia**'s military confirmed a sighting of an airborne object similar to a balloon flying over its territory. Colombia's air force issued a <u>statement</u> on Saturday providing limited details concerning a possible balloon its air defense system had located Friday morning. U.S. military officials on Friday said another **Chinese** balloon was spotted somewhere over Latin America but did not specify its location.
