My main research focus is to understand the work-life interface of individuals with intersecting oppressed identities to promote resilience and wellness. In terms of "work" I examine vocational psychology concepts as informed by contextual factors, racial or social injustice, or systemic barriers for racial and ethnic minority workers. As for "life" I have an interest in quality of life as informed by mental health and health disparities among stigmatized communities.
