#### Who Is Daniel E. Salmon?

Dr. Salmon was founding chief of the USDA's Bureau of Animal Industry, predecessor of today's Veterinary Services. As a member of Cornell University's first class of graduates, he earned his bachelor's degree in veterinary medicine in 1872, and 4 years later. Cornell awarded him the first Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine degree in the country. Today. Salmon is best known for identifying the infectious pathogen Salmonella and pioneering the fight

against contagious diseases. His work contributed immeasurably to improving public health and disease control efforts.

Interested in a career in agriculture, botany, plant pathology, entomology, or other biological sciences?

The USDA Pathways Program: William F. Helms Internship program provides university and collegelevel students with the opportunity to help protect U.S. agriculture and the environment while facilitating global trade of pest and disease-free agricultural goods. Students may experience hands-on activities like inspecting plants, plant products and other regulated items for pests or disease; conducting crop and commodity surveys; assisting with the identification of suspected pests and diseases; or participating in plant health emergency response efforts. Students accepted into the program will receive:

- . Tuition assistance while pursuing a degree (Up to \$5,000 each year the student is enrolled in a degree program);
- Mentoring;
- Paid work experience during school breaks (both summer and holiday periods);
- Possible permanent employment upon successful completion of education, training, and work

#### To Apply

Interested students must apply on-line via www.usajobs.gov. To locate the announcement, type the keywords "William F. Helms" in the search engine located under the "Student and Recent Graduates" tab. Please note you must set up a USA Jobs account to apply. The announcement should be available around the beginning of January 2017. To be eligible you must:

- 1. Be a US citizen;
- 2. Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment in an accredited college or university;
- 3. Be a sophomore or junior in good academic standing with a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA;
- 4. Be enrolled in programs related to agriculture or the biological sciences; and
- 5. Agree to work for the Agency during school breaks (both summer and holiday breaks) a minimum of 640 hours prior to completion of studies.

The on-line application system will prompt applicants to answer self-assessment questions and to submit the following documents:

- · Resume
- . Transcripts for all completed college work to date and proof of current enrollment on at least a half-time basis; and
- . A copy of your DD-214 if you are claiming veteran's preference

#### Internship Experiences

As a Saul T. Wilson, Jr., intern, you will experience the real-world situations facing Federal regulatory veterinarians every day. Working in the field, you may:

- · Assist with veterinary technician duties;
- · Observe and/or conduct testing and identification activities to support disease management programs for livestock such as cattle swine and cervids-
- Contact owners to schedule animal disease
- · Attach animal identification tags and help with recordkeeping;
- Draw blood samples for laboratory testing;
- Brand animals that react to certain tests; or
- Help supervise disinfection and cleaning at affected sites.

Working in one of our animal health laboratories, you may conduct routine tests, log in test samples, track test results, or prepare specimens.

In an office setting, you may assist our disease programs with information gathering and data collection: data verification, tracking, coding, and entry: document review and literature searches: statistical, quantitative, or qualitative analysis; or producing preliminary analytical reports.

We provide a wide range of learning opportunities so our interns are prepared for life in the public veterinary field.
