Two Ways to Complete:

- 1. On-Time = Attempt <u>and</u> earn 15 credit hours each term to graduate in 4 years
- 2. **Accelerated** = Gain your degree in 3 years by earning 15 credits each term and participating in mini semesters/part of terms. You can also get ahead if your major participates in **Degree In Three**.





### Navigate Your Way

The college experience is meant to be fun and meaningful. Don't go by what you hear. Chart your own path with tools like:

- 1. **Undergraduate Catalog** = academic policies and degree requirements, including general education core and recommended classes by term

Advising is more than registering for courses. Your advisor has established checkpoints to help you set your pace and create academic, career, and life goals.

- 4. Pre-Registration Advising (Individual Appointments and Group Sessions by Major)
- 5. Success First Series (year-round sessions for students and parents/guardians)



### **The Office of Student Success**

We advise:

- new students who recently graduated from high school
- current students with less than 30 credit hours
- readmits who are returning to TSU with less than 30 credit hours
- new transfers who are transferring with less than 30 credit hours

The OSS is the designated freshmen advising unit at TSU.

New freshmen are registered by an advisor in the OSS for their first term at TSU, but students will self-register for their second term. Your financial aid can be impacted if you do not register correctly. Get advised during pre-registration and connect with your advisor in the OSS early and often.

During your first year and/or until you earn 30 credit hours, you are assigned an advisor in the Office of Student Success. After earning 30 credit hours, you will transition to a faculty advisor in your academic department.

### Your advisor will...

- 1. Help you navigate college and develop academic, life & career goals
- 2. Lift the freshman advisement (A6) hold after you are advised during pre-registration advising in September and/or February
- 3. Provide in-person and virtual opportunities to connect



- 1. Pre-Registration Advising begins in September (fall term) and February (spring term). Requirements will be shared in your UNIV 1000 class and at www.tnstate.edu/advisement

# THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

### Course Program of Study (CPoS) and Financial Aid

- o If you are receiving aid, you can lose it!
- Aid includes scholarships, loans, and tuition discounts.
- Avoid delays by visiting and emailing the right office(s) based on the aid type. Every question is not for the Financial Aid Office. Talk to the office that offered your scholarship or discount when needed.
- Changing your major at the wrong time can affect your aid.
- Courses that do not align with the requirements for your major (including general education) can affect your aid.
  Know your Course Program of Study (CPoS)!
- Not earning 15 hours each semester can determine if you will continue to receive some aid types.

### Your credit hours matter.

- An advisor registers you for 15 or more credit hours your first semester to align with the Take 15 Initiative and your CPoS.
- There's a difference between Attempted and Earned credit hours. You are not a sophomore until you earn 30 credit hours. Our FAQs explain this difference.
- Talk to your academic advisor in the OSS and your financial aid counselor before you drop a class; it can impact your scholarship and other aid.
- You will self-register for your second semester.



### Academic Language Guide

- The purpose is to help you understand your schedule, acronyms, building codes, and other terminology.
- View all other critical information for academic policies and terms in the Undergraduate Catalog.

### THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

### **Online Classes**

- TSU Online classes can be accessed using eLearn, and TN eCampus courses can be accessed through a separate portal. Use our FAQs to learn more.
- When it's time to self-register for the second semester, you will need to know the difference to avoid additional fees.

### Professional Etiquette & Your Syllabus

- o Bring your laptop or tablet to advising sessions.
- Go to Career Fairs even if you're not looking for a job. It'll help you know what to expect when you're ready.
- Speaking of ready...Remember, freshmen are often selected for internships and study abroad opportunities.
- In emails, always include your name, major, T-number, and a screenshot if you need to resolve an error or restriction.

 Everything about your class and instructor expectations is in the syllabus.
